Let's Charge Ahead



As a former athlete and coach, I have competed in games that demanded a strategic plan to win. At Todd Kaunitz times, this required multiple options – a Plan A

and a Plan B – while at other times we needed to be committed to a singular strategy to bring us victory.

When it comes to fulfilling Jesus' mission of redemption, we have been given one clear game plan: become disciples who make disciples. This is his Plan A. There is no Plan B! Jesus has commissioned us to go and proclaim the Gospel, inviting people into relationship with him. We see this in the Great Commission in Matthew 28.

Jesus' final words to his disciples before ascending was a call to go and tell the world His story. Jesus is the hope of the world and has sent his followers to be His Plan A to take Him to the world! In this announcement, there is one clear and emphatic imperative: "make disciples." Our primary calling is connecting people to Jesus and His ever-restoring life, teaching them to obey, and sending them out! So, all our going, baptizing, and teaching is about making disciples who make disciples. This is overwhelming when you recognize the responsibility with which the church has been entrusted. Acts 4:13 When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were aston-

ished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus.

Who knows without a doubt that you've been with Jesus? Does Satan constantly attack you because you are a threat to him? Peter and John were being threatened over their faith walk with Jesus. They hadn't being subtle, and they certainly weren't "keeping their religion to themselves." The Lord used them so mightily that the highly educated religious leaders were left dumbfounded in their attempt to silence the Lord's servants. Then they remembered the apostles had been with Jesus.

When you've been with Jesus, the presence and power of God is in you. He equips you to do all that He's called you to do - yes, even sharing Jesus with others. Let's show the world the result of being with Iesus.

There are a few things your church can do to prepare to reach out to your community:

1. Make plans to do outreach. If you don't commit to doing it and

pursue His mission.

First, we have been sent by His power. In verse 18, He says, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me." Jesus declares that ALL authority has been given to Him. Jesus is Lord of the universe! In His earthly ministry, Jesus shows power over disease and sickness, wind and waves, and demonic powers. But most importantly, through His death and resurrection, Jesus has power over sin, death and hell! There is nothing in all the universe He doesn't have authority and power over, and this includes every nation. And with His power and authority, we are sent. This is our confidence as we engage the world. We do not have to be afraid, worried, or intimidated. Our confidence does not rest in our abilities, accomplishments, or aptitudes but in His authority! We have been sent by the one who is in complete control of the universe!

Second, we are sent with His presence. In v. 20, He says "... And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." How is Jesus with us? Through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, God's presence is with us. He is Immanuel, God with us! This is where our confidence is found. Just as the Lord comforted Moses and Joshua with His presence when He sent them to conquer the land, Jesus is sending us to conquer the land and usher people out of bondage. All authority has been given to Him and He is with us!

This is why prayer is so essential to the Great Commission. It is vital for us both individually and corporately. We are called to a task beyond our capability; therefore, we need the power of God that is only found in the presence of God. We must be a people who seek His presence through prayer and ask His Spirit to fill us. We don't have to be afraid; He is with us!

make the plans to do it, you won't do it.

- 2. Start praying for the lost on a regular basis and challenge your congregation to passionately do so in their daily prayers.
- 3. Set dates to go prayer walking praying as you walk the streets and then knocking on doors and offering prayers to the local residents.
- 4. Set a date to have an outreach event. Ask for help if you need it.
- 5. Get commitments from members who will volunteer to serve in doing outreach. Pray over every volunteer as they make their commitment to serve.
- Bathe the work of outreach in prayer. Every person, even those who hand out hotdogs, need to be spiritually prepared.
- 7. Follow up with those who come to Christ or ask for prayer at the event. Get their contact information if they are willing to give it.

Don't be pushy if they do not. If you would like help in planning and training your church for the event, please call me. I would love to help you out.

We would love to establish a team that will be willing to help churches in doing their outreach ministry. Please present the need to your church. I will set up a date and time to meet with all volunteers and train them to be outreach specialists.

He along with Attorney Tommie Jo Brode will help attenders create sound policy to help keep individuals and churches safe.
