DRINK LOTS OF WATER

As people age, the ability to notice thirst may decrease, so it's important to keep an eye on water intake, especially when exercising outside in the sun. Dehydration can adversely affect memory and concentration such as an increased risk of falls. As a rule of thumb, aim for at least eight glasses of water per day and be conscious about the type of fluids, choosing water, herbal tea, and fresh vegetable juices over coffee, fruit juices, or sugary sweet soft drinks.
