The floor was opened to nominations. Seeing there were no nominations from the floor, President Dorler asked for a motion to elect these individuals as the Call Committee. Motion was made by Debbie Redditt and seconded by George Shabla. The above named individuals were elected to serve unanimously. President Dorler reminded the congregation that the process is still just beginning and may take an extended amount of time. He informed the membership that just because of a call committee is formed does not mean that a candidate or new pastor is imminent. He cautioned the congregation to remain patient and prayerful.

The floor was opened for nominations for representatives to the Synodical Assembly at Thiel College in June. There were no other nominations from the floor. Pastor Zachrison recommended the slots remain open and advertised that perhaps someone will volunteer to represent Immanuel.

No other business was introduced before the congregation. President Dorler asked for a motion to adjourn. The motion was made by Bryan Timm, seconded by Debbie Redditt. The motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 1210 hours.

### Congregational Meeting

### 6 December 2015

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order by President Robert Dorler at 11:47 hours.

Order of Business:

It was ascertained a quorum was present.

President Dorler presented the 2016 Budget. President Dorler mentioned the budget was available for the past few weeks for review.

Several questions were posed.

- Several categories have an 'X' and what does that mean?
   Treasurer Roemer indicated it means either the change was too great or there was no line item in the 2015 budget.
- What is the 'honorarium'? This is to pay for rostered, ordained clergy to preside over the Eucharist Sundays.
- The cost of trash removal? Immanuel is locked into a contract with Waste Management until February, 2017 at which time Council will explore new options.

A motion from Maria Seifert to accept the 2016 Budget as presented was made, seconded by Stan Holsopple. The Budget passed unanimously.

President Dorler then introduced the second item of business for the congregation. Three members of Council terms are to expire 31 December 2015. They are: John Seifert, Stan Holsopple and Joe Byrne. Stan Holsopple and Joe Byrne are not eligible to be on Council as they have served six (6) years consecutively. John Seifert has agreed to remain on Council for another term. Gretchen Andrews has agreed to run for Council. One position remains open and needs to be filled. President Dorler asked for members to consider serving Immanuel in this capacity.

Char Feiler asked what the length of term is for Council. It is a three (3) year term.

The motion was made by Debbie Redditt to elect those candidate presented to Council. It was seconded by Rick Kuntz and passed.

President Dorler then announced the retirement of Bob Roemer as Treasurer. The search has begun and President Dorler asked if there were any interested members willing to serve. He then invited current Treasurer Bob Roemer to speak on the job, the amount of time needed and the responsibilities. Bob was asked if he would be willing to assist someone in learning the position and he was willing to do so. If no one steps forward, the Congregation through Council may have to advertise and hire from outside.

Hannah Mays asked for time for a public service announcement. She showed the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Christmas Ornament that is for sale for \$5.00 each. She explained the design was done by member Scott Rispin.

President Dorler asked for any further business from the congregation. Seeing there was none, he asked for a motion to adjourn. Scott Rispin made said motion and it was seconded by Bryan Timm. The motion passed and the meeting was adjourned at 1200 hours with The Lord's Prayer.

### **PROPERTY COMMITTEE REPORT- 2015**

### **CHURCH RENOVATION-**

Phase III: Choir chairs are now in place and it is the matter now of completing the financing for the entire renovation. A separate fund has been established to pay for the chairs. The bell choir and tables now have a home opposite the choir area but can be moved to provide extra seating if needed.

### IMPROVEMENTS AND CHANGES-

Both of the church's rental properties are now rented (Powell Ave & 10<sup>th</sup> Street houses) to fairly responsible people. There may be times when they lapse with outside upkeep and we remind them in a good neighborly fashion to take care of our property according to their lease. We have been having problems with the entrance door at the parking lot. It is very hard to unlock with the key for anyone. This will be addressed very soon. Some of the overgrown shrubbery around the church has been trimmed back for appearance and safety sake. Use of our building by various outside groups is a mission entrusted to us. Rules for use and waiver forms for regular and one-time users have been updated to provide them and us of what is expected. Forms for users are to signed by a responsible person for their group.

### **FUTURE CONCERNS-**

Do we need a space in the church for the handicapped? Hallway flooring by sacristy room may be done this year? Church sign needs cleaned and painted? Some outside stonework of the church needs re-pointed? All the wood furniture in the church needs cleaned and treated. A future project are the windows in the educational wing of the church. Glazing has deteriorated and needs replaced and painted. Some materials to do this have been purchased. Energy conservation is always on our mind. What can we need to do to make our church "green"? Replacement fixtures/bulbs, inside and outside, may have us updating the church and yet trying to keep costs at a minimum. There has been some concern about church upkeep, when there are times or circumstances beyond our control. We as a congregation need to step up and do the tasks that need done. The committee is always trying to do what is needed at Immanuel to preserve our legacy. As always it's a matter of funding, time and manpower to address church issues. Any concerns and/or suggestions the congregation may have are always welcomed by the property committee. If there is any particular cleaning/maintenance issue, a note may be left in the office for custodian or property member.

Anyone is welcome at our meetings to learn and offer input. Meetings are usually held the 3rd Tuesday of the month at 7:00 pm at the church.

Although the budget numbers were somewhat effected by Pastor Gail leaving and Vicar Cowey joining the Immanuel family, we finished our fiscal year in the black.

We ended the year with no external outstanding bills or expenditures pending. Thank you to all that made these things possible.

We still owe ourselves approximately \$9,800.00 for the flooring in the church and the remodeling of the West 10<sup>th</sup> St. house. We have repaid ourselves approximately \$4,200.00 in 2015. We continue to receive contributions to eliminate this expenditure.

Listed elsewhere in this annual report are copies of the Designated Fund Balance Report, the Income/Expense versus Budget Report for the year 2015, and a copy of the approved 2016 Budget.

As this will be my last Treasurer's Report, I wish to thank all personnel and committees over these years for your support. As for the congregation as a whole, thank you for your prayers and support and may God's blessings be with all the Immanuel family.
