# Do you know any Korean and/or Cold War MIA families? Please pass on the information below.

VFW Urges MIA Families to Provide DNA Samples Return of American MIAs from North Korea begins

WASHINGTON (July 27, 2018) — Now that North Korea has unilaterally turned over 55 boxes of remains believed to contain missing American servicemen from the Korean War, the new national commander of the VFW is urging the families of Korean and/or Cold War missing to ensure the Defense Department has a DNA reference sample on file to help speed the identification process.

"Some 5,300 of 7,699 American unaccounted-for war dead are believed to be in North Korea, and 111 of our 126 Cold War missing are in the vicinity of the Korean peninsula." said new VFW National Commander Vincent "B.J." Lawrence. "I'm calling on more than 1.6 million VFW and VFW Auxiliary members to canvas their neighborhoods and urge every MIA family, even distant relatives, to provide a family reference DNA sample in the hope that the next identification announcement is their long-lost soldier, sailor, airman, Marine or contract civilian."

According to the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency, all immediate family members, as well as maternal and paternal relatives, are eligible to donate a family reference sample, which is essentially a cotton cheek swab. Relatives should contact a military service casualty officer for information on how to provide a DNA sample.

"Today marks 65 years since the signing of the armistice, or cease-fire agreement, the potential for peace on the peninsula in the macro sense has to be on denuclearizing North Korea, but to the families of the missing, their macro view of the world begins at home, where for more than six decades they have been asking questions that have mostly gone unanswered. This is why ensuring a family reference sample is on file is so important. Identifications can be made through strong circumstantial evidence, but nothing says proof-positive better than an actual DNA match."

# Post 346 sponsored Boy's Stater now competes for up to \$10,000 national award.

LANSING – Justin Baker, a North Farmington High School senior, was named as The American Legion, Department of Michigan Boys State Samsung Scholarship nominee. Baker attended Michigan Boys State in June, his attendance sponsored by Groves-Walker Post 346.

The scholarship was established in 1996 by worldwide electronics leader Samsung to show appreciation for U.S. veterans who came to Korea's aid during its struggle against communist forces in the Korean War. To be eligible an applicant must be a delegate to an American Legion Boys State program and be a descendant of a war-time era veteran. Baker's grandfather was a Korean War veteran.

Baker is an Eagle Scout, a member of the National Honor Society, and has been a member of Farmington's Mayors Youth Council. He is also active in track and is a Lifeguard at the Farmington YMCA. His awards include the Mathematics Department Award and the English Department Award at North Farmington High School. Baker plans on a career in computer science.

Ten National American Legion Samsung Scholars receive \$10,000 each, ten National Runners-Up receive \$5,000 each, and the remaining Department Finalists receive \$1,250 each guaranteed. The awards will be presented at The American Legion 100th National Convention taking place in Minneapolis August 24-30.

The American Legion, Department of Michigan awards nearly \$10,000 in scholarships annually to Michigan youth through programs such as Scouting, Boys State, Girls State, Oratorical Contest, Legion Baseball, and various other scholarship opportunities.

#### Why are the younger Veterans avoiding Veteran Service Organizations? Les Davis, USA(ret) February 17, 2016 (edited for length)

Before I researched why the post-Vietnam generation of Veterans were not joining Veteran Service Organizations (VSO), I asked myself, "Why wouldn't veterans want to be around other veterans?" Truly, participating in a VSO provides a unique opportunity to serve our community with people from all walks of life, and also offers the opportunity to share the bond and comradery that melds us together as proud United States Veterans. After months of research, the answer became obvious: In all of the VSOs that I had the pleasure of visiting, I found that VSOs are standing by and waiting for this younger generation of veterans to just walk in and join like their fathers and grandfathers before them. Many VSOs rely solely on their names to entice these young veterans to show up and join, and most have a marketing campaign that hasn't quite made it into the 21st Century.

The current VSO image and what the younger veteran generation think about local VSOs is real; they see a building with a couple windows, a dimly lit smoke-filled room with a pool table or darts with "Bingo Night" being boldly advertised as the biggest event happening at that particular location. How do we get the younger veterans to be part of that? The answer is we don't. WE MUST CHANGE. The thought that eventually the younger veterans will join because they are missing the comradery is a false notion. There are too many newer and younger VSOs that have popped-up in the recent years for them to join, leaving a vast number of VSOs competing for membership from a much smaller pool of veterans.

The one positive aspect from the VSOs, one that no one can take away, is that they have held firm in the support of the various veteran issues in Washington, D.C. for decades, and have dedicated much of their efforts in resolving very troubling veteran issues involving the Veterans Administration that have surfaced in recent years. The more established veteran service organizations have a voice with the Congress and President regardless of the dominant political party. Politicians listen to them because of the membership numbers which unfortunately are declining.

What positive actions can the VSOs take to build new membership? After talking to Desert Storm, OEF and OIF veterans over the past 9 years, I suggest the following 12 common sense steps to appeal to that younger generation of veterans who are the very life-blood of the existing VSOs:

1) Be honest and transparent when sending out material to attract new members. Educate the younger veteran generation by conveying to them what you have accomplished locally and nationally to ensure that veteran issues stay at the forefront of the discussion. Show them that you are making a difference. Let them know about your whole organization, not just a narrow scope of membership and money. 2) Treat all veterans equally. Both men and women have served honorably in the Armed Forces.

3) Update posts with free Wi-Fi, offer video gaming like an XBOX or PlayStation 4, and install flat screen TVs, and select programming, such as sports programming, that would appeal to all veterans.

4) I know the more seasoned veterans have life experience and perhaps a different frame of reference. But we should never think that the younger generation is any different. You should embrace their energy and let them share their ideas about improving your post; you will be pleasantly surprised with the innovative ideas that they come up with. Be open to these new ideas.

5) Welcome all veterans into your post. When you see someone new walk in, welcome them with open arms, make them feel like they are part of your post and have found a new family and friends. And don't criticize the way they look now or their time in service. If you're welcoming, they may overlook the stale beer smell and nicotine stained walls and stay for a while.

6) Keep your meetings short and to the point. Get younger veterans involved in the administration of your VSO and encourage their involvement. The younger generation, especially millennials, like to solve problems by working and teaming with a group. This is a prime opportunity for the VSO leadership to mentor those younger veterans. Be patient.

7) Turn your post or part of your post into a community type of center. Our younger veterans want a place to network, drop their child off for daycare, or do homework.

8) Turn your post into a place where veterans can network with the community. Invite local business owners, company executives, your local college Veteran's Representatives, or members of the local Chamber of Commerce to speak at your meetings.

9) Don't be afraid to work with other veteran organizations within your community. Build a strong support network for all veterans.

10) If you have a post close to a military base, begin working with the base transition office. This is where VSOs could make a positive impact with the base leadership as well as the surrounding veteran population.

11) Introduce yourself and your post to your local Guard and Reserve centers. Most of the members live, work, and shop in your community.

12) Sign up for and attend every veteran event that you can. Make sure the people in your community know that you are the post to contact when it comes to supporting veterans. Talk the talk and walk the walk.

Post 346 is always looking for ideas to help make our Post more attractive to younger vets. Have an idea? Please bring it to the next Executive Committee meeting on the 4th Thurs. of each month.






