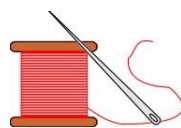

Are you working on your quilt show challenge entry yet???





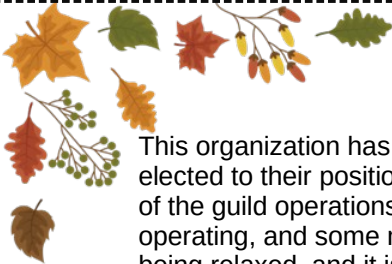
CRAYON CHALLENGE FOR OUR 2023 QUILT SHOW!

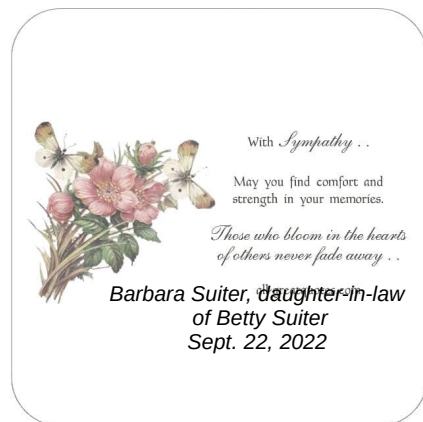

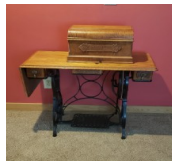
