

WHEN IS EASTER?

Have you ever wondered WHY Easter isn't on the same Sunday every year? I mean, Christmas is on December 25th...period. But Easter slips around the calendar from year to year, forcing us to find it. Why?

Easter is observed on the first Sunday after the first full moon of spring (called the Pascal Full Moon) following the spring equinox. And the Spring equinox marks the moment the Sun crosses the celestial equator – the imaginary line in the sky above the Earth's equator – from south to north. THAT day- the Spring Equinox- always occurs on March 21, according to a decree by the early Christian Church at the Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D. and the Gregorian calendar introduced by Pope Gregory in 1582. Therefore, Easter can fall on ANY Sunday between March 22 and April 25. That's also why Easter and the church holidays leading up to that day (Ash Wednesday, Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday) are referred to as "moveable feasts."

My birthday is April 18th. (And NO, that is NOT a veiled "advertisement"!) Since that date falls in the "window" of potential Easter dates, that means my birthday COULD be on Easter. And, in my lifetime, it HAS been- 1965 and 1976! In 1965, I was 4 years old (YOU do the math!), so I don't remember it. In 1976, I was 15, so I DO remember it. NEITHER time did it make much difference to me. During that period in my life, Easter was ALL about candy, gifts and days off from school and NOTHING about Jesus Christ.

But Easter means SO much to me now. It is true that, without Christmas, there would be no Jesus. But it is also true that, without Easter, there would be no Christ. Easter is when God made the ultimate sacrifice for us. Not simply to satisfy Old Testament prophecy- although it did. NOT simply to satisfy an evil earthly king. But the sacrifice was made for...us. 2,000+ years later...for us. That is HARD to wrap your head around!

Easter is an awesome time of year. It's a time of rebirth. The grass is "greening" up. Trees are budding. Flowers are blooming. The earth is waking up after the winter slumber. And those images are NOT lost on me. Easter is a time for the "greening" up, the budding and the blooming of us, as well. Through the sacrifice Christ made, we are given new life. And that new life is eternal- if we accept Him fully into our lives. And that, my friend, is GOOD stuff! By the way, looking ahead, Easter won't fall on my birthday again until 2049- I'll be 88 years old!

THINGS YOU MAY NOT KNOW ABOUT THE BIBLE

- The Bible was written by about 40 men over a period of about 1,600 years dating from 1500 BC to about 100 years after Christ.
- The first translation of the English Bible was initiated by John Wycliffe and completed by John Purvey in 1388.
- The Bible has since been translated in part or in whole into over 1200 languages and dialects.
- The Bible was divided into chapters by Stephen Langton in 1228. The Old Testament was divided into verses by R. Nathan in 1488 and the New Testament by Robert Stephanus in 1551.
- The entire Bible divided into chapters and verses first appeared in the Geneva Bible of 1560.
- Today, the Bible is the largest seller of all books published.

11. Americans spend \$1.9 billion on Easter candy. That's the second biggest candy holiday after Halloween.

Most of what is known about him comes from his two works; <u>The Confessio</u>, a spiritual autobiography, and his <u>Epistola</u>, a denunciation of British mistreatment of Irish Christians. He described himself as a "most humble-minded man, pouring forth a continuous paean of thanks to my Maker for having chosen me as the instrument whereby multitudes who had worshipped idols and unclean things had become the people of God." St. Patrick is also widely known for driving the snakes out of Ireland. And while it's true there are no snakes in Ireland, there probably never have been- the island was separated from the rest of the continent at the end of the Ice Age.

Although it's not known for sure why we celebrate St. Patrick's Day on March 17th, one theory is that it's the day St. Patrick died. It is a religious holiday in Ireland, with many businesses closed. Have you ever wondered why the shamrock is so closely tied to St. Patrick's Day? Well, none other than St. Patrick himself used it to explain the Holy Trinity (Father, Son, Holy Spirit) to the pagans. Celebrate St. Patrick's Day...but don't forget the strong religious ties it bears!

Because of the spider bite, he gets spiderlike powers: super-strength, ability to climb walls, and great jumping skills.

Did you realize that, as a Christian, you've got super powers, too? Sure, you can't climb buildings, or jump really high, but like Peter Parker, we underwent a huge transformation when we became Christians.



To understand this transformation, we've got to go way back in time to Adam and Eve. Adam and Eve lost their right-standing with God. They were created to walk and talk with God. When Adam and Eve sinned and ate the fruit from that tree, they were no longer right before God, and that's because God can't condone sin. God couldn't have the relationship He had with them before.

"For God loved the world so much that He gave His one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life. John 3:16

Jesus came and gave us a way back to God; we were separated from God but God loved us too much to let us die in our sins.
