Dear Friends,

Dawn and I want to thank everyone for your generosity to us at Christmas. We are very grateful for the wonderful cards, thoughtful presents, generous monetary gifts, gift certificates, gift cards, and delicious treats. We cherish your thoughtfulness and kindness.

At the beginning of a new year, it is common for us to take stock of our lives and consider areas in which we hope to improve and grow. This very often means changes in diet and exercise, becoming more organized, and various other self-improvement projects. It is important for Christians to give some thought to their spiritual lives as well. I want to invite you to consider your prayer life and how God may grow and enrich your time with Him this year.

I love that our congregation provides the LCMS' devotional *Portals of Prayer* for every one of our members. In fact, last year we doubled the number of large-print copies in order to make this resource accessible to more people. This resource is not only a daily devotional, but also a prayerbook. Many people are unsure of how to pray or how to use their prayer time, in addition to offering a few requests and the Lord's Prayer. This devotional provides an order for family devotions and a myriad of helpful prayers for our usage. While there are innumerable tools and resources available to us, a Christian armed with a copy of the Bible (you don't need a particular version) and *Portals of Prayer* has everything they need for life-giving encounters with God. I would like to draw your attention to the following parts of the devotional – which are present in every quarter's issue.

<u>In the Front</u>: Order for Family Worship, Martin Luther's morning and evening prayers, and prayers for usage at meals.

In the Middle: A nice devotion for each day. Each devotion includes two suggested readings from the Bible

– one of which is from the Psalms, a traditional part of daily prayer going all the way back to the ancient Church. The author then provides a brief reading which reflects on the passages read in a way that helps the reader see how the passage applies to their daily life. Each devotion concludes with a short prayer informed by the readings.

<u>In the Back</u>: Suggested prayers for morning and evening of each day of the week, suggested prayers to be offered at Noon and Midnight (regardless of one's work schedule they will most likely be awake at one of the 12's), prayers for the holy days of the particular season, and suggested prayers for things that we encounter in the normal course of our daily lives (sickness, suffering, grieving, thanksgiving, for peace, a birthday prayer, etc.).

One of the common themes of my teaching is that Christian discipleship is not as complex as we sometimes make it seem. I am convinced that every Christian would like to grow in their walk with God, but many people are in need of some tips for how to begin. While there are a variety of duties that are my responsibility, the chief purpose for which you have called me is to care for your souls. If I may provide you with any assistance in growing in your life of prayer or Scripture reading, please speak with me or drop me an email. There are many things which I like to do, but helping people connect with Jesus is one of the things which I most love to do.

A Note from Pastor Regarding Hospital Visitation

One of the consequences of the laws passed to protect hospital patients' rights to privacy is that the hospitals are not always able to let congregations know when their members are hospitalized. While hospital chaplains and volunteers will sometimes give parish pastors a call, this is infrequent and not a reliable means of learning this information. Consequently, I invite you to give me a call if you are going to be hospitalized or if you discover that one of our members has been hospitalized (I always protect my sources). It is my pleasure to visit our members when they are in the hospital - to share God's Word, prayer, and the Lord's Supper with them. Additionally, if you are going to have surgery whether it is inpatient or outpatient - please let me know as I would love to come to the hospital and pray with you prior to your procedure. Over the years, I have needed to leave my house at 3:30-4:00 am a number of times in order to carry out this service and it was my good pleasure to do so - and so please do not worry that your surgery is too early for me to meet with you at the hospital on the morning of your procedure. I typically arrive 20 to 30 minutes after the time when the patient is instructed to report to the surgical unit, and this allows me an opportunity to share Scripture and pray with the person at a time when they are simply waiting for nurses and anesthesiologists to look in on them. God hears our prayers and His Word comforts us, and so it is very important to me to offer these gifts of God at such times. Please feel encouraged to call me on my cell phone (day or night) if I may be of service to you. May our good Lord bless you in every time of need.
