

Dear Friends,

The year 2020 will be forever marked by the COVID-19 global pandemic.

It started as a year full of promise. On March 1, we opened the first phase of the new Calico Rock Museum & Visitor Center. Months of planning, giving and hard work had given way to a beautiful facility poised to ultimately unite all of our museums under one roof.

Two weeks later, we opened **The Marketplace** in the former museum building. Tourists were flocking to town. Then, everything changed. Three days later, **Governor Asa Hutchinson ordered all public venues closed**, including the Calico Rock Museum & Visitor Center.

For four months, all of our facilities were closed, our staff unemployed, and a decade of forward progress screeched to a halt.

This moment in history called for **decisive leadership** that too often felt hollow and woefully inadequate. The generosity of our partners and the Federal C.A.R.E.S. Act provided resources that allowed us to reopen, rehire our staff, and begin anew.

Frankly, without the support of the **Windgate Foundation** we would not be here today. They invested in our community, our museum, and our mission amidst our largest building project and, then, in the early days of the pandemic, funded our operations. Simply, **they saved us**.

After a year of hardships, we proudly submit our **2020 Annual Report**, which just as easily might have never been produced. Its publication is a testament to the dedication and tenacity of our supporters, board, and, most importantly, our amazing staff.

Together, we are **PREPARING FOR A BETTER TOMORROW**.

French fur traders were traveling along the White River some 200 years ago when they looked up and saw the massive rocks jutting up from the water. The rocks had different colors that made resembled calico cloth popular at the time. They called the spot **Calico Rock** and the name stuck.

When the railroad began construction along the river in 1903, they met those rocks and nearly met their match. After setting off **massive blasts**, they were able to clear the way for the railroad, but removed all that beautiful calico-coloring in the process.

After 200 years of weathering and aging, the colors are returning to the bluffs. Just as the colors are returning to the bluffs, Calico Rock is experiencing a **rebirth**, too.

The Calico Rock Museum & Visitor Center is leading the way for a better tomorrow. Since the museum opened in 2010, we've seen a major rebirth. Small shops and restaurants are opening in buildings that were once crumbling along the Main Street Historic District.

The Calico Rock Community Foundation has pledged \$30,000 in capital improvements in our community over the next three years. This investment will come on the heels of \$500,000 in **investment** in our community in the past decade.

We are leading our community by preserving our past, celebrating today, and envisioning a better tomorrow.

Visitor Center Services

Main Street Calico Rock

We are a member of the Main Street Arkansas Downtown Network and provide economic recruitment and business support for our community, especially the Main Street Historic District.

Services During the Pandemic

During the pandemic, we have provided free WiFi to support local students who have no home internet access as they learn virtually. We provide community information through Facebook and e-mail communications. And, we have assisted our local businesses in cutting through government regulations and applying for assistance.

Adventures in Art & Science

The museum hosts Adventures in Art & Science every Tuesday during the school year. Prior to the pandemic, we were hosting 52 students every week. This program was suspended during the pandemic and will resume when it is safe to do so.





Native American Weekend

The most successful event in the history of the museum has been the Native American Heritage Weekend. This event includes storytelling, sharing Native American artifacts, and the Oklahoma Fancy Dancers.

Due to the pandemic, this event was sadly cancelled for 2020. We plan to resume this event in 2021.

The Storybook Project

The Storybook Project is a special project of the Calico Rock Community Foundation. Volunteers go into the North Central Unit of the Arkansas Department of Corrections to allow inmates to record themselves reading a book to their child. The recordings and the books are then mailed to the children, so they can hear their incarcerated parent reading to them. In 2020, this program was temporarily suspended due to COVID-19 restrictions.




F. Stowe Easton Endowment Fund

A savant of railroad history and anything related to trains, F. Stowe Easton was a hard worker and caring brother. Our Endowment Fund began in 2014 with a generous gift from his estate. The fund will provide for future capital needs, expansion, and long-term security of the foundation.

In December, we published our latest book that preserves our history and culture. *Calico Chronicles* shares the writings and oral histories of six people who lived in Calico Rock. These stories are raw and give an unvarnished glimpse into the past.

This book is on sale for \$10 at the Calico Rock Museum & Visitor Center and The Marketplace. All proceeds benefit our efforts to preserve our culture and revitalize our economy.

MUSEUM EXPANSION



The Calico Rock Museum & Visitor Center moved into our new 14,000 square foot facility in March, just weeks before the pandemic forced our four-month closure upon order of Governor Asa Hutchinson. We reopened under restrictions in July with just the visitor center and art gallery open to the public. We have continued construction on the heritage center during the pandemic and plan to open the new center in March or April.

Mr. Paul "Gene" Lockie Founding Trustee 1925-2020

Late one afternoon, Gene Lockie gathered with three friends at Don Quixote's on Main Street in Calico Rock for coffee. After a spirited conversation, it was roundly decided that Calico Rock was falling into the pages of history and something must be done. The town could not crumble around them.

That pot of coffee redefined Calico Rock.

Gene Lockie was always a doer. During his career as an engineer and plant manager, he grew his company, dutifully cared for his employees, and profited his hometown. Gene believed a person should always contribute to the town where they lived. He felt it was a sacred duty to leave the place better than you found it.

Gene Lockie brought that same attitude to Calico Rock when he and his wife, Reva, retired. There wasn't a civic organization, board, or committee that Gene Lockie didn't join or serve on. He was an active member of the Lions Club, 20/20, CORE, Calico Rock Industrial Development Corporation, school board, church session, Calico Rock Chamber of Commerce, and the Ozark Gateway Tourism Council. Gene was busy and Gene got things done.

The four friends who shared a pot of coffee that afternoon founded the Calico Rock Community Foundation and the Calico Rock Museum & Visitor Center. They set in motion a complete renovation of Main Street, spurred the development of eleven new businesses, and led in the capital investment of \$500,000 in our community in the past decade.

Gene Lockie accomplished many things for which Calico Rock owes a tremendous debt of gratitude. There was just one thing Gene Lockie never accomplished, though it wasn't for lack of trying. Gene Lockie wanted to rebuild the town's train depot to house a visitor center. The railroad flat-out refused. Gene, we're building a small replica of that depot inside our visitor center in your honor. *Thank you for your service, our dear friend*.

In Memory



Mr. Elmer Dean Hudson, Sr. Founding Trustee 1931-2020

Dean Hudson was one of four friends gathered at Don Quixote's on Main Street in Calico Rock for coffee late one afternoon fifteen years ago. Calico Rock was dying and something had to be done. After emptying their cups, they went outside to get in their cars and looked and Main Street. They vowed something would change.

That pot of coffee redefined Calico Rock.

Dean was at home with his beloved Peggy and his grandson Lucas when he passed just a few weeks ago. He was 89. Dean was a veteran, a school teacher, high school principal, school superintendent, business owner, cattle farmer, bird hunter, and friend. Dean was a family man who loved a good laugh and was never shy about his love for Calico Rock.

Dean and Peggy were married over 67 years and raised two children-Dean Jr. and Joni. They loved their grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and extended family. Dean and Peggy joined with Peggy's parents, Tip and Retha Wiseman, to build the first skilled care nursing facility in the area in 1967. Today, White River Health Care continues to "care for those you care for" having been family-owned and operated for three generations.

Dean was involved in every organization in town and was responsible for many of the good things we see in Calico Rock today. Dean was a founding trustee of the Calico Rock Community Foundation and from that organization came the Calico Rock Museum & Visitor Center. Dean served on our board as vice chairman for a decade before stepping down due for health reasons.

Dean Hudson was passionate about his beliefs and advocated strongly for his positions. He was a true friend. Our community will mourn his loss and feel his absence. Dean wanted to see the new museum completed and marveled at the photos we posted on the internet. Dean, we're building that museum and we're continuing your legacy. *Thank you for your service, our dear friend*.
