Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

Mark 13:24-32

Are we living in the end times? "There is nothing new under the sun." (Ecclesiastes 1:9). It wasn't the music group Semi-Sonic in their popular hit 'Closing Time' that first said, "Every new beginning comes from some other beginning's end" No, Seneca, a Roman philosopher living around the time of Jesus, expressed the same sentiment a long time before Semi-Sonic came along. Seneca said "We deceive ourselves by looking for death ahead of us, whereas a great part of death has already taken place" (Letter 1 to Lucilius) Or about a hundred years later Emperor Marcus Aurelius wrote that, "If you've seen the present then you've seen everything—as it's been since the beginning, so it will be forever" (Meditations, 6.37) Don't we hear so much anymore about the end of the world and the coming cataclysm of Armageddon? Times are bad, and we do hear so many doomsday predictions, but there is something timeless in our gospel today to strengthen how we face such days. Jesus speaks about certain signs in the world like 'falling stars', a 'darkening sun' and 'shaking heavens', but Jesus doesn't say these things should frighten us believers. Jesus offers these sayings as to strengthen the faith of His disciples.

Such signs are actually hopeful omens indicating the nearness of redemption for those awake and aware of God's intervention. Why do I say that? Let's look at the natural example that Jesus uses for how to interpret the signs of the times. In Mark 13:28-29, He says, "Learn a lesson from the fig tree. When its branch becomes tender and sprouts leaves, you know that summer is near. In the same way, when you see these things happening, know that he is near, at the gates". I find great hope that Jesus uses an example of springtime and new life blooming again as the signal of His return. He didn't say, "When the fig tree's branch dries like a bone, breaks and blows away, then know he is near". And He didn't say, "When the fig tree's branch is burnt by lightning....." No, the Lord of the Living said, "When the fig tree sprouts leaves...." Jesus is using an image of new life and eternal beginnings for those who are watching for and alert to Him. As Christians we are people of hopeful resurrection, good overcoming evil and life overcoming death. So, the more we hear late night fear-stoking televangelists or any other media conspirators of depression, we should be moved to be more expectant and joy-filled about the abundant life Jesus will bring with Him. Our generation did not invent prophets predicting destruction and gloom. They have always been around. St John writes in his first letter, "...test the spirits to see whether they belong to God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world" (4:1). Closer to our time, St Pope John XXIII said in his opening address to the Second Vatican Council, "We must quite disagree with these prophets of doom who are always forecasting disaster, as if the end of the world were at hand." (Par #8 Oct 11, 1962).

By Jesus using the image of new life budding from the fig tree, I find Him to be uplifting and encouraging toward us disciples, that we persevere hopefully and remain faithful about good works despite nihilistic naysayers and those glorying in gloom. There is a time to diagnose disorder, but the faithful always keep ever in mind the redemption and abundant life to come. What we work on today may bear fruit tomorrow for Jesus taught us that 'by their fruits you will know them.....' (Matt 7:16) We all know the end-day is coming. Actually, each new day we are closer than we were yesterday. But we do not fear such an end, because faith informs us as to what God is doing among us. The way St Paul described this ever-present end of all things, was that "creation awaits with eager expectation the revelation of the children of God..... for we know that all creation is groaning in labor pains even until now" (Romans 8:19, 22). Again, it has all been said before. For us, it amounts to "What are we hearing in it?" We are not discouraged; rather, although our outer self may waste away, our inner self is being renewed day by day" (2 Corinthians 4:16). It is not the end, but only the beginning.
