Remembering Barbara Woods

After a difficult health journey that began suddenly in mid-November, we lost Barbara Woods on January 19. The loss has still not quite set in.

Barbara had been retired just a little more than a year when she became ill. She was just settling into retirement and thinking about opportunities for travel and for mission work. She was as involved in our church as a person could be. She was our deacon chair. She taught Sunday School. She was a lead kitchen and meal person as well as our flower and decoration chair. There are so many events and activities that we associate with Barbara: Hanging of the Greens, our Christmas Dinner, our annual Cook-Off, the Easter Breakfast. She participated in the CROP Walk each year. She took part in nearly every mission trip. She actively participated in AMOS.

And beyond the official duties and programmatic involvements, she was just a warm, genuine, caring person. She could be outspoken, of course, but that was what made her authentic. She listened to other's perspectives just as she shared her own, and she valued every person, no matter who they were.

I don't generally use this space to eulogize a particular person, but because of the depth of Barbara's involvement and leadership – she was our moderator, the lay leader of the church when she became ill - and because of the shock of this loss, this is what we are all thinking about and dealing with just now.

Barbara touched so many lives. Our church was packed for her funeral, with around 100 more joining online. Thank you to so many who worked hard for us to host the service and provide the meal following, just as Barbara had done so many times.

In these days, I am trying to focus on gratitude. How many times did we hear Barbara say, "Thank you, thank you, thank you!" I am grateful for all she meant to us; our lives are so much richer and the whole Ames community is so much stronger because of her. I am grateful for the way our church came together to support her and others who have struggled in these last months - it has been a difficult stretch - and I am grateful for the way we have supported one another.

Now we are called to move forward with gratitude, to be thankful for each day we have and use each day for good. "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it."
