Five Books to Read for Lent

If you're still looking for a spiritual book that can serve as a devotional this Lent, here are five suggestions.

The Imitation of Christ, by Thomas a Kempis

If you have not read this book yet, what are you waiting for? Even if you have, what are you waiting for? This is, put simply, the best book of Catholic spirituality ever written. It will challenge you by how *radically* it calls you to separation from the world, and to the interior life, in pursuit of the imitation of Christ. The only happiness is found in renunciation of world and self in pursuit of Christ, which, in the end leads you to the Eucharist, the source and summit of the Catholic faith.

The Spiritual Exercises, by St. Ignatius of Loyola

This is a classic of Ignatian spirituality, composed of meditations and prayers and mental exercises. St. Ignatius originally wrote these to be carried out by first-year Jesuit novices on a 28-30 day retreat, but they can just as easily be performed by anyone and fit into your Lenten devotions. According to Hans Urs von Balthasar, the purpose of the book is to help people learn to choose God's will over their own.

The Dolorous Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ, by Bl. Anne Catherine Emmerich

This book was a key influence on Mel Gibson's film *The Passion of the Christ*. Emmerich was an Augustinian nun, stigmatist, and visionary who reportedly had the contents of the book revealed to her by Mary while Emmerich was in a religious ecstasy. They should be read with the same caution any private revelation is, but the book is a very intense portrayal of the passion of Jesus Christ.

The Screwtape Letters, by C.S. Lewis

This has always been my favorite book by Lewis. Written in the form of a series of letters from a senior devil to his apprentice, advising him what techniques to use (and which ones to avoid) in leading a person to Hell, the book is both amusingly funny as well as a good reminder of all the wiles that have tricked me from time to time. (And which, sometimes, still do.) I reread it

often to be reminded of how I am, once again, falling a victim to Satan's temptations. But the book is also a good story of final perseverance and redemption.

The Book of Job

Of course, the classic work about human suffering, being tested by God, our inability to fully understand His ways, is the Book of Job. But also, and more important to some for Lent, Job presents the human perseverance and faith in God when confronted with the incomprehensible.

Cinco Libros para Leer en la Cuaresma

La Imitación de Cristo, por Thomas a Kempis

¿Si todavía no han leído este libro, que están esperando? ¿Aunque ya lo hayan leído, que esperan para leerlo? Este libro es, para ponerlo de una manera simple, el mejor libro de la espiritualidad católica que jamás se haya escrito. Los retara en como radicalmente los llama a una separación del mundo y de sí mismos para ir con Cristo, lo cual, al final los lleva a la Eucaristía, la fuente y la cumbre de la fe católica.

Ejercicios Espirituales, por San Ignacio de Loyola

Este libro es un clásico de la espiritualidad de San Ignacio, compuesto de meditaciones, oraciones y ejercicios mentales. San Ignacio originalmente escribió estos ejercicios para que fueran hechos por los novicios Jesuitas en un retiro de 28-30 días, pero se pueden fácilmente hacer por cualquier persona y los pueden acomodar en sus devociones Cuaresmales. De acuerdo a Hans Urs von Balthasar, el propósito del libro es para ayudar a la gente a elegir la voluntad de Dios en contra de la propia voluntad.

La Pasión Dolorosa de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, por la Beata Anne Catherine Emmerich

Este libro fue una influencia clave en la película de Mel Gibson *La Pasión de Cristo*. Emmerich fue una monja Agustina, estigmática, y visionara que reporto que el contenido del libro le había sido revelado por la Virgen María mientras que Emmerich estaba en un éxtasis religioso. Se debe leer con la misma cautela sobre cualquier revelación privada, pero el libro es un cuadro muy intenso de la Pasión de Jesucristo.

Las Cartas Astutas, por C.S. Lewis

Este ha sido siempre mi libro favorito por Lewis. Escrito en la forma de una serie de cartas de parte de un viejo diablo a su aprendiz, aconsejándole las técnicas que usa (y las que tiene que evitar) para poder llevarse a una persona al infierno, el libro es tanto divertido como también un buen recordatorio de todas las patrañas en las que he caído de vez en cuando. (Y que a veces, todavía caigo.) YO he releído este libro a menudo para recordar como soy, una vez más, cayendo víctima de las tentaciones de Satanás. Pero el libro es también una buena historia de perseverancia final y de redención.

El Libro de Job

Claro está, esta obra clásica acerca del sufrimiento humano, probado por Dios, y nuestra inhabilidad de entender completamente sus caminos, así es el libro de Job. Church Regulations Regarding Fast and Abstinence

ABSTINENCE from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though made of animal fat.

FASTING means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given day. Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On fast days, two additional smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength. However, the two smaller meals together may not equal one full meal. Moreover, eating solid foods between meals on fast days is not permitted.
