Muslim Refugees and Jesus

The focus of much news in our country in recent days has been the effort of our President to ban refugees from seven Middle Eastern countries for a limited time period. Certainly all countries have the right to determine what foreigners are allowed into their countries. There has been an understandable concern in western nations in recent years about Islamic terrorism. We also hear reports about the trouble that many European countries have had with integrating Muslim immigrants into their societies. In some parts of France, for example, police are reluctant to enter parts of their country that are dominated by Muslim immigrants.

What has not received any attention is the things that the true God is doing with many of these Muslim immigrants. My wife and I have a missionary friend who has worked in Vienna, Austria, for many years. Evangelical churches are quite small in most of Europe and have difficulty in having effective outreach to native Europeans. Last year thirteen new members were added to her church. Eleven of them were Iranians. The church has found considerable openness among Muslims to the gospel.

We also have a missionary friend in Sweden. Sweden has taken in more refugees per capita than any other European nation. Our friend's church recently opened up its basement to refugees. At one point they were housing thirty people, mostly from the Middle East, at the same time. They have had many opportunities to talk about Jesus.

A network of new churches for Muslim converts has sprung up in several European countries. One church in Berlin added 1,200 former Muslims in three years. Most of them were Afghans and Iranians. At a church in Hamburg last year a largely Iranian congregation had 600 Pakistanis and Afghans baptized during one service. *The Daily Beast* reports that thousands, perhaps even tens of thousands, of Muslims have become Christians across northern Europe.

Javad migrated from Iran to Athens in 2008. A roommate there asked him to come to an Iranian church. He had never heard of such a thing, but he went. He soon embraced the gospel. Now he is seeking out other Muslim refugees in Greece and sharing the gospel with them. He says that he sees two or three Muslims each day decide to trust in Jesus. Javad also works in a refugee center that provides practical aid. He says that more than 2,000 Muslims there have become Christians in the last eight years. (Breakpoint, 11/4/2016)

The lesson for us is that we should pray for Muslim refugees when we see and hear stories in the news about them. If we ever have the opportunity to encounter Muslim refugees or immigrants, we can't assume that they won't be open to the gospel. The true God may just have prepared them for an encounter with us.
