November is Stewardship Month Are you practicing good Stewardship?

Merriam Webster defines Stewardship as the conducting, supervising, or managing of something *especially*: the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to one's care. We, then, as members of the church, would be considered Stewards of the church and also its members. To belong to our congregation is to be a steward. Some may say that "stewardship" is just a polite way of referring to financial giving to the church. But it's far more than that.

What does being a good steward mean? For the answer to that question, let's look at our vision. We want to be a 4G congregation: Gather, Grow, Go, and Give. We will continue to gather together to worship God, whether that be on Sunday morning for worship or Sunday school, for Youth Group, Praise Band or choir. As Christian stewards we try to manage time wisely and in a balanced way, and we give our time gladly to family and friends, to strangers, to the community, the church, and to ourselves.

The global mission of the United Methodist Church states: "We are to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." Gathering for worship, study, fellowship, and fun; growing in depth, maturity, and numbers; going in service to others and inviting them to church; and giving of our time, talents and treasures...by being good stewards, working together, supporting one another in good times, and comforting them in hard times, this is how we, as United Methodists show our good stewardship. Are you a good steward of the church and it's people?

Our scripture lesson from yesterday and today was taken from Romans 8:11-30: "...God's Spirit beckons. There are things to do and places to go! This resurrection life you received from God is not a timid, grave-tending life. It's adventurously expectant, greeting God with a childlike 'What's next, Papa?' God's Spirit touches our spirits and confirms who we really are...."
