Partnership Activity	Status
<u>Medical Continuing Education</u>	No new action taken in this area.
<u>Consideration of combining this committee with Military Transition and Readiness</u>	Met with Military Transition and Readiness Committee to determine if we should consider merging. Outcome of the discuss was to remain as organized.
<u>Training for Separating Military</u>	The committee continued efforts to expand this opportunity. Presentation has been made to TeCMEN concerning this program and several “interns” have been placed with Doolittle Inst. NWFSC is working to continue with the Solar Ready Vets program by utilizing this program.
<u>Utility, CTE, Public Safety Training</u>	NWFSC law enforcement academy has gain authorization to serve as a “selection center.” This will allow separating vets with law enforcement training to have that training evaluated and applied to state training requirements.

Operation “SMOKE” CONOP

Commander’s Intent:

To conduct quad-county joint firefighter training with 14 local Fire departments from four neighboring counties (Okaloosa, Santa Rosa, Walton, and Escambia)

The departments include: Okaloosa Island, Destin, Walton County, Ft Walton Beach, Mary Esther, Ocean City/Wright, Eglin AFB, Niceville, Crestview, Holley/Navarre, Florosa, North Bay, Midway, Pensacola, Pensacola NAS.

Primary purpose of Operation SMOKE is to:

- To promote dialogue and cooperation between local fire departments and Hurlburt Field Fire Emergency Services Flight, as well as enhance firefighting capabilities
- Strengthen partnerships through multiple training scenarios while honing firefighter skills and enhancing comradery.
- To enhance fire protection of residents living in and around Okaloosa, Santa Rosa, Walton, and Escambia counties.

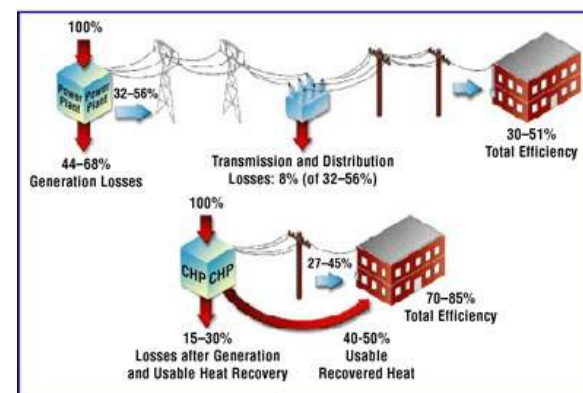

Exploring ways to save money or find additional funding. With immediate needs, attempting to fast-track project.</p>
<p><u>Earthwork Fill Material</u></p>	<p>County and Hurlburt staff are exploring options to obtain fill material for upcoming work</p>
<p><u>Street Signage</u> County can help installation with in-house street sign development</p>	<p>Continuing idea development</p>

CRITERIA SPECIFIC TO INTERNSHIPS

- The internship, even though it includes actual operation of the facilities of the employer, is similar to training which would be given in an educational environment
- The internship experience is for the benefit of the intern
- The intern does not displace regular employees, but works under close supervision of existing staff
- The employer that provides the training derives no immediate advantage from the activities of the intern; and on occasion its operations may actually be impeded
- The intern is not necessarily entitled to a job at the conclusion of the internship
- The employer and the intern understand that the intern is not entitled to wages for the time spent in the internship
