

FROM VICAR

Dear Members of Trinity,

I pray that all of you are doing well! Since I will be writing a newsletter throughout my time here in Hampton, I would like to use this as an opportunity to briefly address each of the 10 Commandments, as Luther explained them in his Large Catechism. This month, we will address the First Commandment:

You shall have no other gods.

What does this mean?

We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things.

In this commandment, we are commanded to have God as our one and only God. But what does it mean to have a god? Luther explains, that "a 'god' I the term for which we are to look for all good and in which we are to find refuge in all need. Therefore, to have a god is nothing else than to trust and believe in that one with your whole heart." According to Luther, the intention of this commandment is to require the believer to have true faith and confidence of the heart, which always directs the Christian to the one true God and to cling to Him as the One who will help, save, comfort, and defend them.

However, this commandment is broken whenever we fear, love, and trust in something else in our time of need. This is called idolatry. Luther explains, "Idolatry does not consist merely of erecting an image and praying to it, but it is primarily a matter of the heart, which fixes its gaze upon other things and seeks help and consolation from creatures, saints, devils. It neither cares for God nor expects good things from Him sufficiently to trust that He wants to help, nor does it believe that whatever good it encounters comes from God." Therefore, to worship something that is not God is idolatry and idolatry is nothing more than placing one's own fear, love, and trust in something that promises to help you, but is unable to. In short, an idol is something that one seeks comfort and security from, but never ever receives that true comfort and security.

But for us Christians, we have true comfort and security because it comes from the LORD, who sent His only begotten Son into the world to save us from our sins. God wants us to fear, love, and trust in Him alone because He is the only True God who loves us, wants to take care of us, and saves us from our sins through faith in His Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord. As Luther says, "Whatever good thing you lack, look to Me [God] for it and seek it from Me [God], and whenever you suffer misfortune and distress, crawl to Me [God] and cling to Me [God]. I, I myself [God], will give you what you need and help you out of every danger. Only do not let your heart cling to or rest in anyone else."
