

Stirring The City By Pastor Mike Snyder

Matthew 21:1-11

As we approach Holy Week, we remember that Jesus road into it on a donkey. We call it Palm Sunday. And it set off what I've often considered it to be the greatest worship service this side of heaven. The church today would do well to use it as a model in our own attempts to worship God. For example, one of the aspects of worship that we find in the text is its visibility in the surrounding community.

In verse ten, we're told that "when Jesus entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred, and asked, 'Who is this?" We're also told that "the crowds answered, 'This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee." It's interesting to consider what actually stirred the city. glance, we may think that it was the arrival of Jesus that stirred the city. But as we look deeper into the text, we find that it wasn't Christ's arrival, but the arrival of the crowd with Him that caught the city's attention. It's my guess, that if Jesus were to walk into Jerusalem alone, without the crowd, the city would have remained unmoved and at peace. It was the "very large crowd" (vs. 8) that accompanied Him that caused the people of the city to say, "Who is this?" And it was the "very large crowd" that answered, Jesus..."

As people who worship Jesus 2000 years later, we do well to recognize that the world around us is not so often stirred by Jesus as it is stirred by our response to Jesus. The world can't see Jesus (He's invisible you know). But the world *can* see how we respond to Jesus. And it's our response to Jesus that moves those around us to ask the deeply theological question: "Who is this?" And our answer can change the world. Our response to Jesus has the potential of stirring "the

April 18th, Maundy Thursday Service

The Worship Team would like to invite you to the Maundy Thursday Service, April 18th at 6:30 p.m. I have to tell you this is one of my favorite services that Chapel Hill provides. I am reminded of how difficult Jesus's day was, knowing how brutal Friday would be. And yet he was still loving us, and giving us an amazing gift of the ceremony of Communion. Just a little background for you if you are not familiar with Maundy Thursday. God, in his infinite wisdom, had been orchestrating this moment for hundreds of years. Jesus arrives in Jerusalem at the time Passover is being celebrated. The Jewish people had been observing Passover for hundreds of years, celebrating their release from slavery in Egypt during Moses's time. The last plague that God sent to try and convince Pharaoh to let the Jewish people go was to put to death all of the first born males. The Jewish people had been instructed to kill a lamb and mark their doorframes with the blood. This way the Angel of Death would "pass over" their homes, not killing the first born. Fast forward Jesus arrives at the time of Passover, to be the lamb, to be sacrificed for you and for me. But the night before he is crucified he has a last meal with his disciples. It is there that he performs and teaches them the ritual of Communion. Please join us as we acknowledge the weekend that changed everything.

Good Friday Tenebrae Service at Bennett Memorial UMC

This Good Friday on April 19th, we have been invited to attend a collaborative service at Bennett Memorial United Methodist Church that includes all of the area United Methodist churches. This service is a Tenebrae service that begins at 7:00 p.m. The address for Bennett Memorial UMC is 503 Letcher St. The word "tenebrae" comes from the Latin meaning "darkness." The Tenebrae is an ancient Christian Good Friday service that makes use of gradually diminishing light through the extinguishing of candles to symbolize the events of that week from the triumphant Palm Sunday entry through Jesus' burial. It is a service of prayer and contemplation and will be immediately followed by a three day prayer vigil that takes us into Easter.

Prayer Vigil

This vigil is divided into fifteen minute segments that are open to all members of each congregation and participants are invited to sign up for more than pne segment. We will not have to travel to any of the churches to pray, but each of us can pray in our own space. We will have some prayer resources available to help guide this time of prayer. 
