This Pastor's corner I would like to look at what it means to belong to the community and family of God from an Old Testament and New Testament prospective. In the Old Testament we see that what one person did could affect the whole community. For example, God forbid the Israelites from following other gods in Deuteronomy 6:13-15 and intermarrying with the people in Caanan that they were supposed to be driving out from the land in

Deuteronomy 7:3-5 all for good reasons look it up. When we look at Israel's history, we can see what occurred when they forgot who they were, God's Chosen People. When they became so synchronist in their worship of God that they allowed other belief systems i.e. religions of the people around them that they forgot their identity and their call to be different from the world. This ultimately led to their downfall as recorded in 2 Kings chapter 21.

Now let's look at the New Testament and our responsibility as children of God, brothers, and sisters of Christ. In John 1:12 we are told because we believe in his name (Jesus Christ) we are considered children of God. Jesus Christ tells us in Matthew 12:46-50, Mark 3:31-35 and Luke 8:19-21 that we are his brothers and sisters, 50"For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother." Then he looked at those seated in a circle around him and said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! 35 Whoever does God's will is my brother and sister and mother." 21 He replied, "My mother and brothers are those who hear God's word and put it into practice." So, we have established that we belong to the family of God, but what does that mean? Well let's look at putting the word of God into practice. Jesus tells us in John 13:34-35, 34 "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. 35 By this everyone will know that you are my disciples if you love one another." And again, in John 15:12 Jesus says, 12 "My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you." We have a responsibility to remember who we are and who we belong to, who it is we call the Lord.

All too often the world seems to work its way into our relationships with each other as someone who claims to be in the family introduces some new idea or interpretation of what Jesus really meant and by doing so leads us in a direction that we should not go insisting on having our own way in worship or in missions or even what is acceptable behavior within the family.

So, lets cast off the temptation to be synchronist in our beliefs and accepting every new teaching or interpretation that comes along and let's get back to listening to what Jesus says defines members of his family and what it means to live a life that tells the world who we belong to.

Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent, which is a time of fasting & repentance in preparation for the Easter celebration.






# Vacation Bible School 2024 – SCUBA

#### Lutheran World Relief - by Walthagaye Leavitt

Lutheran World Relief is an international non-governmental organization that focuses on sustainable development projects and disaster relief and recovery. It was founded in 1945 to collect and send aid to people living in post-world war II people in Europe. Today, LWR helps communities living in extreme poverty adapt to the challenges that threaten their livelihoods and well-being and responds to emergencies with a long-term view.

In 2023, 551,700 guilts and kits were delivered to over 14 countries in need. Carson City donated 263 quilts to that number in 2023. Thanks to all who helped by prayers, donations, and time to that project.

The meeting was opened at 6:40 pm with prayer by Pastor Ian. In Phil's absence, the meeting was led by Pastor Ian.

**Finance Report**: Robin reminded us that Tyler Wilson's name needs to be removed from the bank records and Aaron's added.

Balance on hand checking \$2007.29

Identified giving \$6644.56

Emergency Fund \$6459.38

Memorial Fund \$428.53

- -Robin had to take \$2200 from the emergency fund to make pay role this week.
- -The fund balance report is done and there will be copies placed on the welcome center for those interested.
- -The bill for the District Ministry shares is \$1594 and can be paid in parts. 1st payment is due May 1, then October 1 with final payment October 30.
- -The bills from Fire Pros were discussed. Their latest was for \$596 which is due Jan 3<sup>rd</sup>. Having a contract was discussed to do the minimum needed for the Insurance. Aaron will talk to Phil and discuss how to proceed.
- -The yearly CCLI and CCVI License renewal are due. CCLI amount is \$311.75 and the CCVI is \$338.00.
- -Wilson's Plumbing and heating bill is still outstanding for the sewer work done at the parsonage. Maple Rapids will be paying part of this.
- -The budget was placed before the board. Accepted.

**Trustees:** Pastor lan reported that once again the Wilson Plumbing and Heating were called because the water heater was malfunctioning. The screen was plugged again d/t the high mineral content of the water. There is another part that will circulate the water, so this does not happen. They are to finish that project.

- -The door for the kitchen has been ordered but is not in yet.
- -The metal files of music need to be moved out of the choir room to protect from moisture and mold.
- -The heat in Noah's Ark SS room is very warm. This has been an ongoing problem. The registers will get checked to see if they are closed.
- -There is a large amount of water in the basement. Robin and Robert moved much stuff out of the rooms and mopped. This has also been an ongoing problem especially when ice builds up in the eaves.
- -The room above the sanctuary needs to get cleaned and organized. WalthaGaye volunteered to do it on a Monday night class night between studies.
- -Superior Carpet will be coming February 2 to clean the fellowship hall and Scotch Guard it. WalthaGaye will also check with them to see if they can spot clean the coffee stain in the sanctuary.

- -Toni also asked to use the sound deafening boards. It was decided that we could use them in the fellowship hall to improve the echo. UWFaith will cover them.

Outreach: WalthaGaye reported that over 80 Christmas cards were sent to shut ins and previous members.

- -338 pounds of Bibles and Christian literature was donated to Mission Cry from area churches and Carson City UMC.
- -UWFaith provided gifts for a Christmas Family.
