John MacArthur, in his book *Twelve Ordinary Men*, fleshes out the character of each of the twelve disciples, using the various mentions of them in the New Testament. Meet Andrew!

Andrew was actually the first to follow Jesus when he was a disciple of John the Baptist. The Baptist saw Jesus passing by and said, "Look, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29).

What did Andrew do? He followed Jesus. Then he went and got his older brother, Simon Peter, and brought him to Christ, saying, "We have found the Messiah," the one we have been waiting for (John 1:41-42).

Andrew, as MacArthur points out, brought people to Jesus. Like the young boy with a lunch of five small barley loaves and two small fish. And out of that, Jesus thanked the Father



for the food, then kept breaking the lunch into pieces to miraculously feed 5000 men plus

women and children, with twelve baskets left over (John 6:1-13)!

Andrew, the disciple who longed for the Messiah, the one who brought others to Jesus, the one who believed in miracles, the one who cared.

Thanks to you and everyone who helped make it possible for me to receive a care package with supplies while at the recovery house.
