Redditch Older People's Day 2017

On Thursday 9th March 2017, around 100 people attended the annual Redditch Older People's Services showcase event.

A wide range of organisations came along, including Act on Energy, Severn Trent Water, CAB, Community Safety, Herefordshire and Worcestershire Fire Service, Care and Repair Worcestershire, RBC Home Support Service, Mobile Occupational Therapists, Lifeline, Dial-a-Ride, Shop-mobility, Living Well, Cinnamon Trust, Montana Mobility Centre, Redditch Association for the Blind, Sight Concern, Charisma Training (services including audible aids for the blind and partially-sighted), Redditch Talking Newspaper, Age UK, Home Instead (Senior Home Care, dementia specialists), Alzheimer's Society, Transition Redditch and Repair Café Redditch, Contact the Elderly (tea parties for isolated older people) and Carers Careline (support for carers in Redditch).



There was a really good atmosphere, with people who came to the event and also the representatives of the organisations enjoying finding out about all the different services on offer.

Refreshments, a raffle and a good welcome were provided by the Older People's Forum - who also have refreshments and entertaining and informative speakers and at 9.30am on the second Thursday of every month at the Ecumenical Centre.

Health Chats



Health Chats is a **FREE** interactive 3 hour public health training awareness session essential for any member of staff or volunteer who works with members of the public. Learn about the current health priorities in Worcestershire and gain the skills to have an informed two minute **Health Chat** encouraging people to make healthier choices.

The training covers health issues such as alcohol consumption, smoking, physical activity, diet, mental well-being and ageing well. By the end of the session you will be able to:

- Raise healthy lifestyle issues with people with confidence
- Assess peoples motivation and inspire them to make positive changes
- Signpost people to appropriate local support services.

You will also receive a Health Chats certificate and supporting information to help you have conversations about living a healthy lifestyle.

NEW Lifeline is a telecare service available 24 hours, 365 days a year to any vulnerable people living within the Redditch and Bromsgrove districts as well as surrounding areas.

It allows residents such as the elderly, disabled or those with serious health problems to continue to live independently in their own homes.

A Lifeline unit installed in the home and a portable pendant allow the user to call for help in an emergency at any time of day or night. Our Monitoring Centre Operators will receive the call and assist the user with their emergency.



NEW: No landline available?

You can now have all the comfort of Lifeline in your home without the need for phone lines, sockets or extensions.

The new Lifeline units use GSM technology, similar to mobile phones, so you can put them wherever you want as long as there is a power supply.

NEW: need help away from home?

For your security and peace of mind, the new 'Footprint' pendant allows you to call for help wherever you are.

In an emergency, it can even tell us your exact location.

Features include:

- Emergency call button
- Two-way voice communication
- GPS satellite tracking
- Full roaming SIM included
- Fall detection feature
- Suitable for lone workers
- Suitable for those living with dementia
