unreasonable to maintain without draining the money we
will be receiving from the sale of the building.

The good news is we have a little more time before we are homeless. The very kind buyer of our building said he does not intend to demolish and rebuild until the 1st of next year due to freeze laws. So, once we close on the sale in October, we will have that money in the bank and we will be able to stay here at no additional charge. And here is the best news. The new owner of our property intends to name the housing complex he will be building "Legion Square." It warms my heart. Keep in mind, we will never be homeless. The Elks have graciously offered for us to use their building in the short-term for flexibility during moving and build out.

Our budget will be tight during this coming summer. We will be sending out our annual donation letter. Last year our membership all gave generously and we received \$5,000. In addition to the donation letters, it is so important to support the Post by visiting and attending dinners and activities. Keep those paper products rolling in! That is such a big help with our daily needs. And don't forget about the Queen of Hearts Raffle. The Post receives 50% of total sales, less expenses.


Please come down to the Post for Memorial Day (Monday May 29) this year!



An "oldie but goodie" scam is coming back strong for 2023!

"Check washing" is once again on the rise across the country. It's very appealing for crooks because it's very low tech, and almost anyone can do it. Crooks steal checks left in mailboxes or remove mail deposited in USPS collection boxes. Using bleach or nail polish remover, they erase the payee name and check amount leaving your signature intact. After drying, checks are rewritten for more money and deposited or cashed at banks or check cashing businesses.

Six ways to foil check washers.

- 1) Pay your bills online. As long as you are not on an open public Wi-Fi connection, paying bills online is now safer than sending a check through the mail. Your bank account and payment systems for your bills are encrypted.
- 2) Drop off your outgoing mail to a Post Office. Don't leave envelopes containing checks in your own mailbox for pickup or in outdoor USPS collection boxes after the last pickup time of the day.
- 3) Use a pen with blue or black non-erasable gel ink. This is far more difficult to remove than ballpoint ink. A good brand of pen for this use is a Uniball gel pen.
- 4) Don't let delivered mail sit in your mailbox. Check your mailbox as close to delivery time as possible each day. If you'll be away, ask a trusted friend or family member to collect it or have the post office hold it until you're home.
- 5) Monitor your bank account. Don't wait for your monthly statement, go online to review account balances and look for checks drawn against them.
- 6) Contact your bank as soon as possible after you see suspicious activity. Banks are generally required to replace funds stolen via fraudulent checks, but only if reported within 30 days of the date of your next bank statement. Also contact the US Postal Inspection Service and the credit reporting agencies TransUnion and Equifax.

Many product recalls fall under the radar.

Product recalls can be a matter of life and death, but only 6% of Americans respond to them. CPSC.gov and Recalls.gov are two of six federal websites that list product recalls. To check thrift store finds and items purchased from third party sellers such as eBay, check: recalls.gov/search.html.

If you have a recalled product, stop using it and contact the manufacturer. The Manufacturer may send you a replacement or a repair kit. If you need to dispose of a product, make sure other people and/or children can't access it. And YES, fill out those registration cards tucked into product packaging or on manufacturer's websites so



you can get recall notices. You can always skip questions on the form about your age and/or income if you're not comfortable providing that information

Post 346 Membership **Eligibility**



Legion membership eligibility. Veterans or active duty military who have served at least one day of active duty in the US Armed Forces any time after Dec. 7, 1941 AND have been honorably discharged or are still serving. Potential member must present a valid DD-214 (DD-217, DD-256, or DD-257) with membership application.

Auxiliary membership eligibility. 1) Relationship to veteran: Grandmother, mother, sister, daughter, granddaughter, male or female spouse, or self (for female veterans). Per IRS regulations, step-relatives are not eligible. The IRS only allows two degrees of a blood line, so great granddaughters and beyond are not eligible. Potential member must present a valid DD-214 (DD-217, DD-256, or DD-257) of the related veteran with membership application.

2) a) Potential member must be related to a LIVING veteran by one of the relationships stated AND veteran is a current member of the American Legion.

b) OR, potential member is related to a DECEASED veteran who served at least one day of active service during eligible time periods (Apr. 6, 1917 to Nov. 11, 1918 and any time after Dec. 7, 1941) AND was honorably discharged. Deceased veteran does not have to have been a member of the American Legion.

Sons of the American Legion membership eligibility.

1) Relationship to veteran: All male descendants adopted sons, and stepsons. Potential member must present a valid DD-214 (DD-217, DD-256, or DD-257) of the related veteran with membership application.

2) a) Potential member must be related to a LIVING veteran by one of the relationships stated **AND** veteran is a current member of the American Legion.

b) OR, potential member is related to a DECEASED veteran who served at least one day of active service during eligible time periods (Apr. 6, 1917 to Nov.11, 1918 and any time after Dec. 7, 1941) AND was honorably discharged. Deceased veteran does not have to have been a member of the American Legion.
