After reviewing this incident I find you in violation of department rules and regulations, specifically:

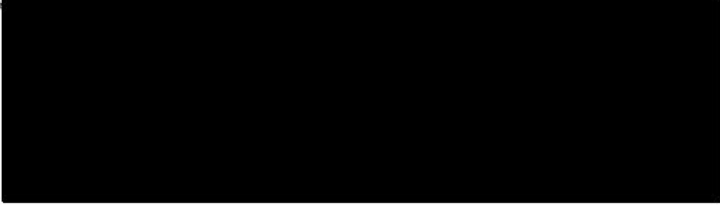

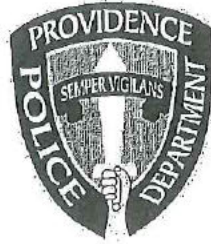

Captain,

Over the past several months, I have noticed a pattern of the district 7 cars failing to answer the radio and being out of service for extended periods of time. I have asked Sergeant Mancini to address this issue on several occasions.

I spoke to Lieutenant Reddy about this issue as he had recently received a complaint of slow or no response from Patrolwoman [REDACTED] to calls for service. Today, I monitored a call for service at 0708 hours to car 172 [REDACTED] for a report of a property damage at 460 Smith Street. This location is around the corner from the substation where Ptlw. [REDACTED] was responding from. I responded from the area of the district 7 substation to the complainant's location and awaited Ptlw. [REDACTED] arrival. Ptlw. [REDACTED] did not arrive on scene until 0737 hours. It should be noted that the complainant was waiting outside in 39 degree weather.

It is my opinion that Ptlw. [REDACTED] failed to respond to this call for service in a timely fashion, without a reasonable explanation and was therefore neglect in her duties.

The purpose of this message is to remind you of the importance of using your paid time off benefits, particularly sick leave, responsibly and appropriately.

As a City of Providence employee, you are afforded several ways in which to accrue paid time off. You are entitled to utilize vacation provided that you request time off in advance and obtain approval from your supervisor. You accrue sick leave in increments of one day per month for a total of 12 days per year; two of which can be used for personal time. And finally, you may discharge 3 floating holidays per year which, like vacation requests, are subject to approval by your supervisor and must be requested in advance.

We are aware that some employees are calling out without the appropriate time available to them, and they are being "docked" pay as a result. This is not an acceptable practice and is considered unauthorized leave.

Therefore, it is important to remind you that any employee who calls out or requests time they do not have available, will be subject to progressive disciplinary action up to and including termination.

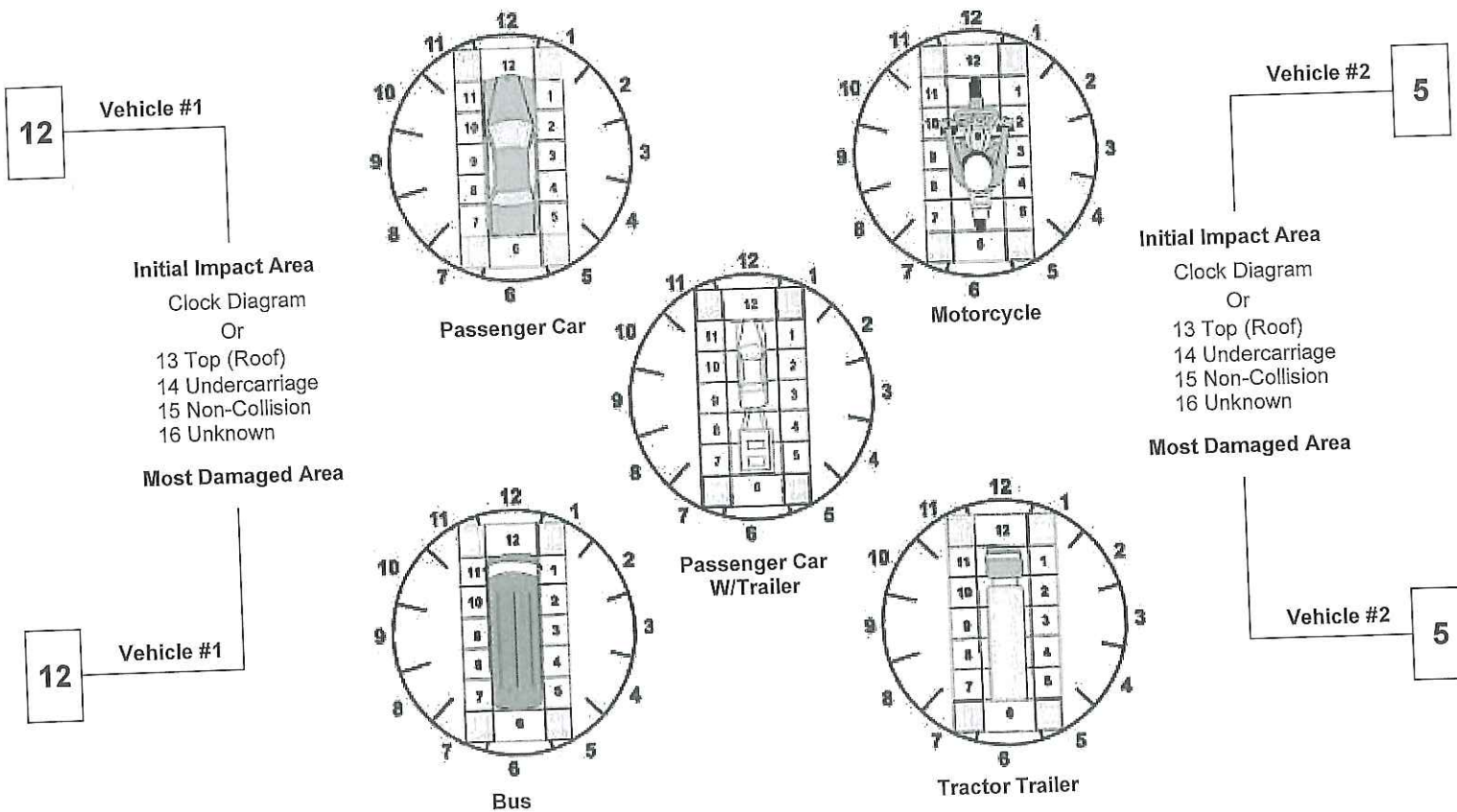

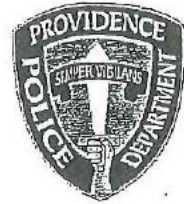

On Friday September 29, 2017 at approximately 2332 hours, Car 333 was on routine patrol in the area of Sackett St and Niagara St.

At the above time, police observed a light-skinned Hispanic male wearing white pants and a green windbreaker operating a green dirt bike on Sackett St towards Broad St. It should be noted that another unidentified male was following the operator of the dirt bike on a motorcycle. Police observed the operator of the dirt bike having mechanical trouble and upon observing police, tried to take off towards Broad St. When the bike suddenly stalled, police observed the operator abandon the dirt bike in the middle of Sackett St and flee on foot towards Emerson St. Police followed the subject towards Emerson, giving commands from the cruiser to stop. Police broadcast via CH1 the description of the fleeing subject (see above) and direction of travel. While following the subject, the unidentified male on the motorcycle tried several times to impede police, pulling his motorcycle in front of the following cruiser several times and braking.

Police successfully maneuvered around the impeding motorcycle, exited the cruiser and made contact with the fleeing subject at Sackett St and Emerson St. The subject, upon observing police, stopped briefly, but took off on foot again on Sackett St, this time towards Niagara St. As police gave chase, the subject on the motorcycle again attempted to impede police, who were now on foot, driving on the side of the pursuing officer, and at one point cutting in front. The subject on the motorcycle purposely drove towards police, who had to briefly jump out of the way to avoid being struck. This interruption in the foot pursuit caused police to fall behind, at which point the subject fleeing on foot jumped onto the back of the assisting motorcycle, which sped away at a high rate of speed on Sackett St towards Elmwood Ave. Assisting units arrived a short time later and attempted to catch up to the fleeing motorcycle. The motorcycle was last seen traveling outbound on Elmwood Ave at a high rate of speed.

The abandoned dirt bike (94 Kawasaki VIN: [REDACTED]) was towed to Central Station from Sackett St and Niagara by All City Towing.

During the search of the area of the fleeing motorcycle, police came upon a purple 2002 Honda motorcycle (VIN: [REDACTED] in front of 42 Hamlin St. The motorcycle, bearing RI motorcycle registration [REDACTED], was parked on the street in front of a driveway and unregistered. The vehicle was towed by East Side Towing for safe keeping.

On Friday, October 27, 2017 at approximately 0230 hours, Police (Car 322, Ptlm. Endres) were on routine patrol in a marked Police vehicle in the area of 343 Broad Street. At this time Police observed a red Toyota Camry [REDACTED]. The Camry was occupied by one male subject, known to Police as Dean Fernandes (DOB [REDACTED] 1953). Fernandes was seated in the driver's seat. It should be noted that all businesses that the parking lot services were closed and the area is known a high levels of narcotic activities.

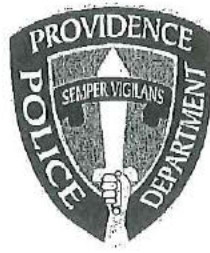

Summary:

On Saturday, September 23rd, 2017, at 0154 Hours, Patrolman [REDACTED] and Patrolman Scarcello were assigned to the Van Gogh Lounge detail. While outside of the establishment monitoring individuals as they left Van Gogh Lounge, officers were alerted to a subject being removed from the establishment by Van Gogh security. After security removed the unknown subject from the establishment, Ptlm. [REDACTED] and Ptlm. Scarcello escorted the subject on Harris Avenue and ordered him to go to his vehicle.

Upon escorting the subject off the property, Ptlm. [REDACTED] and Scarcello were alerted by a security staff member that their presence was needed inside of Van Gogh Lounge, as a disturbance had broken out inside the bar by the "DJ booth", in an area cordoned off for "VIP". Ptlm. [REDACTED] and Ptlm. Scarcello entered the bar and began to walk to the rear, where several subjects were observed "holding back" approximately three subjects and keeping them from striking each other. Seeing the potential for further violence between various subjects who were actively striking each other, Ptlm. [REDACTED] determined at this time to utilize his department issued "OC Spray" in order to subdue the subjects who were actively fighting with each other and to attempt to make an arrest of the two subjects. It should be noted that due to the size and movement of the crowd at this time, it was determined unsafe to attempt to make an arrest for officer safety, as additional units had yet to arrive.

As Ptlm. [REDACTED] and Ptlm. Scarcello escorted the subjects to the front exit, another disturbance began between more subjects in the "VIP" area. It was at this time that it was determined that more officers were needed to disperse the crowd and for officer safety.

As officers began to respond to Van Gogh Lounge, Ptlm. [REDACTED] and Ptlm. Scarcello continued to separate subjects who were actively engaged in physical altercations or were taking aggressive stances with others.

As other officers began to arrive on scene, disturbances continued inside of Van Gogh between other patrons requiring the arriving officers to intervene. As police began to escort the subjects observed to still be acting in an aggressive manner to the outside, disturbances began to form in the middle of the street.

Officers began to incrementally disperse the crowds and block the streets; in order to prevent vehicle traffic from causing possible harm.

As responding officers continued to disperse the crowds that were forming on Harris Ave., Ptlm. Northup and Ptlm. Scarcello returned back inside of Van Gogh lounge where two subjects were observed to be grabbing at each other at the "DJ Booth". Both subjects were screaming and yelling at each other as police separated the two, with the main aggressor being pulled off the DJ and escorted towards the exit of the club.

As the remaining subjects inside of the establishment were escorted out of the bar, the additional officers on Harris Ave made the following arrests: Torrence N. Johnson (DOB [REDACTED] 1994), Tiara L. Monteiro (DOB [REDACTED] 1994) and Rubel Rivera (DOB [REDACTED] 1992).

Johnson was ejected from Van Gogh and continued to cause disturbances outside on Harris Ave with other subjects who were from the bar. Ptlm. [REDACTED] approached Johnson and ordered him to get into his vehicle and leave. Johnson refused to comply with Ptlm. [REDACTED] commands, and took a "fighting" stance and then lunged at Ptlm. [REDACTED] in a threatening manner. It was at this time that Ptlm. [REDACTED] deployed his departmental issued "OC Spray" and administered one burst to Mr. Johnson's facial area and subsequently took him into custody without further incident.

Monteiro (who was visibly intoxicated police detected a strong odor of alcohol emanating from her breath and clothing) was observed to continue to arguing with various subjects who were outside of the bar, and upon being ordered to leave by Det. Garcia and Det. Silva, was taken by Rivera to their vehicle. Monteiro continued to scream expletives and threats towards

both police and others, while flailing her arms in an aggressive manner.

A short time later, Monteiro and Rivera were observed to stop their vehicle on the other side of Van Gogh on Harris Ave, and began to act in an aggressive and threatening towards each other after exiting their vehicle. It was at this time that Det. Garcia and Det. Silva began to separate the two. During this time, Monteiro continued to flail her arms, striking Det. Silva in the face. It was at this time that Det. Silva and Garcia attempted to take custody of Monteiro. While this was happening, Rivera began to grab Monteiro and pull her away from Det. Silva to prevent them from making the arrest. Once Monteiro was secured and in custody, detectives Garcia and Silva took custody of Rivera.

Johnson, Rivera, and Monteiro were all charged with RIGL 11-45-1; "Disorderly Conduct", and transported to Central Station in marked Providence Police Cruisers to be held for the next session of 6th District Court.

While Johnson was being processed, Johnson was afforded the ability to use the [REDACTED] located in the cell block. While being searched in the cell block, Johnson was found to be in the possession of suspected marijuana; two small clear plastic "baggies", weighing under one (1) ounce. The suspected marijuana was seized by Ptlm. [REDACTED] and placed into a sealed envelope for testing and placed into the Narcotics Safe; located in the Patrol Bureau. Johnson was given Universal Summons 16-409-157555 for RIGL "21-28-4.01 C (2) iii - possession of marijuana, less than one (1) ounce" with a court date of Tuesday, October 3rd, 2017 at 09:00 AM at Rhode Island Traffic Tribunal.

It should be noted that as a result of this incident, additional officers from other districts within the city responded (approximately 20 officers) to assist in the dispersal of the large crowd gathered on Harris Avenue.

Narrative

On Saturday September 23, 2017 at 0154 Hrs. I responded to a disturbance call at club Van Gogh located 115 Harris Avenue. As I arrived on the scene there were several police officers on the scene dispersing a large unruly crowd. I talked to the two Police Officers assigned to the Club Detail Ptlm. [REDACTED] and Ptlm. Scarcello. And they informed me they were outside the establishment monitoring individuals leaving the Club. Both Officers were alerted that a subject was being removed from from by Van Gogh security. After security removed this subject from the establishment, Ptlm. [REDACTED] and Ptlm. Scarcello escorted the subject on Harris Ave. and ordered to go to his car.

Upon escorting this subject off the property, Ptlm. [REDACTED] and Ptlm. Scarcello were alerted by a security staff member that their presence was needed inside of Van Gogh Lounge, as a disturbance had broken out inside the bar. This area is cordoned off for "VIP". Ptlm. [REDACTED] and Ptlm. Scarcello entered the bar and began to walk to the rear, where several subjects were observed "holding back" approximately three subjects and keeping them from striking each other. Seeing the potential for further violence between various subjects who were actively striking each other, Ptlm. [REDACTED] determined at this time to utilize his department issued "OC Spray" in order to subdue the subjects who were actively fighting with each other and to attempt to make an arrest of two subjects. It should be noted that due to the size and movement of the crowd at this time, it was determined by the Officers to be unsafe to attempt to make an arrest for officer safety, as additional units had yet to arrive.

As Ptlm. [REDACTED] and Ptlm. Scarcello escorted the subjects to the front exit, another disturbance began between more subjects in the "VIP" area. It was at this time that more officers were needed to disperse the crowd and for officer safety.

As officers began to respond to Van Gogh Lounge, Ptlm. [REDACTED] and Ptlm. Scarcello continued to separate subjects who were actively engaged in physical altercations or were aggressive stances with others.

As other officers began to arrive on scene, disturbances continued inside of Van Gogh between patrons requiring the arriving officers to intervene. As police began to escort the subjects to still be acting in aggressive manner to the outside, disturbances began to form in the middle of the street.

Officers began to incrementally disperse the crowds and block the streets, in order to prevent vehicle traffic from causing possible harm.

Torrance Johnson DOB [REDACTED] 1994 was ejected from Van Gogh and he continued to cause disturbances outside on Harris Ave. with other subjects who were from the bar. Ptlm. Lopez approached Johnson and ordered him to get into his vehicle and leave. Johnson refused to comply with Ptlm. Lopez's commands, and he took a "fighting stance" and then lunged at Ptlm. [REDACTED] in a threatening manner. It was at this time that Ptlm. [REDACTED] deployed his departmental issued "OC Spray" and administered one burst to Mr. Johnson's facial area and subsequently took him into custody without further incident.

A total of three people were arrested and charged with disorderly conduct and transported to Central Station. The individuals arrested were identified as Torrance Johnson DOB [REDACTED] 1994, Tiara Monteiro DOB [REDACTED] 1994, and Rusel Rivere DOB [REDACTED] 1992.

I talked to Torrance Johnson DOB [REDACTED] 1994 who was inside the Patrol Car and wanted him to tell me his side of the story on why he was arrested. Mr. Johnson was intoxicated and refused to talk to me. He was just complaining about the "OC Spray" in his eyes. I told him that he can wash out his eyes when he gets to the Cell Block.

There was no other people from the club who wanted to talk to me about what happened in the club. I monitor the Police radio when the Detail Officers asked for more Police units to help disperse the crowd at club Van Gogh. When I arrived on the scene I witnessed a large unruly crowd on Harris Ave. being dispersed by Police. It took the presence of several Officers to prevent any other fights from happening.

I find that Ptlm. [REDACTED] use of force was justified and within policy. Mr. Johnson was asked several times to leave the area and he refused to comply with Ptlm. [REDACTED] his commands. Then Mr. Johnson wanted to fight with Ptlm. [REDACTED] who was justified and within policy in using departmental issued "OC Spray" in subduing Mr. Johnson.

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On 9/23/15 Det. Desmarais retrieved one envelope and paperwork from the NOC safe located in patrol pertaining to Torrence Johnson DOB [REDACTED] 94. Upon opening the envelope Det. Desmarais observed two clear plastic bags of suspected marijuana (net Wt 6.7g). Det. Desmarais then performed a Duquenois Levine Regent field test on a small portion of the suspected narcotics which tested positive for traces of marijuana. On Saturday, September 23rd, 2017, at 0154 Hours, Patrolman [REDACTED] and Patrolman Scarcello were assigned to the Van Gogh Lounge detail. While outside of the establishment monitoring individuals as they left Van Gogh Lounge, officers were alerted to a subject being removed from the establishment by Van Gogh security. After security removed the unknown subject from the establishment, Ptlm. [REDACTED] and Ptlm. Scarcello escorted the subject on Harris Avenue and ordered him to go to his vehicle.

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As the remaining subjects inside of the establishment were escorted out of the bar, the additional officers on Harris Ave made the following arrests: Torrence N. Johnson (DOB [REDACTED] 1994), Tiara L. Monteiro (DOB [REDACTED] 1994) and Rubel Rivera (DOB [REDACTED] 1992).

Johnson was ejected from Van Gogh and continued to cause disturbances outside on Harris Ave with other subjects who were from the bar. Ptlm. Lopez approached Johnson and ordered him to get into his vehicle and leave. Johnson refused to comply with Ptlm. [REDACTED] commands, and took a "fighting" stance and then lunged at Ptlm. [REDACTED] in a threatening manner. It was at this time that Ptlm. [REDACTED] deployed his departmental issued "OC Spray" and administered one burst to Mr. Johnson's facial area and subsequently took him into custody without further incident.

Monteiro (who was visibly intoxicated police detected a strong odor of alcohol emanating from her breath and clothing) was observed to continue to arguing with various subjects who were outside of the bar, and upon being ordered to leave by Det. Garcia and Det. Silva, was taken by Rivera to their vehicle. Monteiro continued to scream expletives and threats towards both police and others, while flailing her arms in an aggressive manner.

A short time later, Monteiro and Rivera were observed to stop their vehicle on the other side of Van Gogh on Harris Ave, and began to act in an aggressive and threatening towards each other after exiting their vehicle. It was at this time that Det. Garcia and Det. Silva began to separate the two. During this time, Monteiro continued to flail her arms, striking Det. Silva in the face. It was at this time that Det. Silva and Garcia attempted to take custody of Monteiro. While this was happening, Rivera began to grab Monteiro and pull her away from Det. Silva to prevent them from making the arrest. Once Monteiro was secured and in custody, detectives Garcia and Silva took custody of Rivera.

Johnson, Rivera, and Monteiro were all charged with RIGL 11-45-1; "Disorderly Conduct", and transported to Central Station in marked Providence Police Cruisers to be held for the next session of 6th District Court.

While Johnson was being processed, Johnson was afforded the ability to use the eye-wash station located in the cell block. While being searched in the cell block, Johnson was found to be in the possession of suspected marijuana; two small clear plastic "baggies", weighing under one (1) ounce. The suspected marijuana was seized by Ptlm. [REDACTED] and placed into a sealed envelope for testing and placed into the Narcotics Safe; located in the Patrol Bureau. Johnson was given Universal Summons 16-409-157555 for RIGL "21-28-4.01 C (2) iii - possession of marijuana, less than one (1) ounce" with a court date of Tuesday, October 3rd, 2017 at 09:00 AM

at Rhode Island Traffic Tribunal.

It should be noted that as a result of this incident, additional officers from other districts within the city responded (approximately 20 officers) to assist in the dispersal of the large crowd gathered on Harris Avenue.

On Friday, September 29, 2017 at 0055 hours police (Car 322, Ptlm Calandra & Ptlm Endres)

were dispatched to 571 Broad St. for report of a Robbery. Upon arrival police spoke with the victim [REDACTED] DOB [REDACTED] who made the following statements to police.

[REDACTED] stated that while walking on Harvard Ave a dark skinned male with braids wearing a white T-shirt, and a dark skinned woman, with red pants and a black hoodie approached him and asked for money. [REDACTED] stated that he took a dollar out to give to the female. The female then took all the money in his hand (\$13) pushed him and told him to "get out of here". [REDACTED] stated the subjects were last seen on Harvard Ave. Police updated the description of the suspects on PPD channel 1. Sgt McGregor responded to the scene.

Car #323 Ptlw Fonseca and Ptlm [REDACTED] observed multiple subjects in front of 60 Harvard Street. Police approached the subjects and observed two suspects, male and female matching the description of the suspects who committed the robbery. It should be noted that upon arrival all subjects were uncooperative and hostile. Police approached a vehicle outside of the above listed location and observed a female subject later identified as [REDACTED] DOB [REDACTED] wearing red pants and a black shirt. Police requested [REDACTED] to exit the vehicle for further investigation. While Ptlw Doldoorian was performing a terry pat another female subject later identified as Sakiesha Russell (DOB [REDACTED] 1977) became irate and approached police during the search. Ptlw Fonseca gave Sakiesha two verbal commands to back away. Sakiesha did not comply and continued to approach Ptlw Doldoorian. At this time Ptlw Fonseca used an open hand push to create distance between police and Sakiesha. Sakiesha said "Don't fucking touch me bitch" and then squared up with Ptlw Fonseca and pushed her hands off of her. At this time Ptlm [REDACTED] deployed one burst of his department issued OC spray. Police then placed Sakiesha in handcuffs without further incident. Sakiesha was transported to Central Station and was held for the next session of 6th District Court. Sakiesha will be charged with Disorderly Conduct and Simple Assault on a Police Officer. Sakiesha was afforded the ability to decontaminate in the cell block.

Sgt Scott McGregor responded to the scene and conducted a supervisors use of force inquiry. Ptlm [REDACTED] actions were determined to be within policy .

Supervisor Use of Force Inquiry**

Narrative

On 9/29/17 at approximately 0055hrs., Ptlm Calandra and Ptlm Endres responded to 571 Broad Street for a report of a robbery. Upon arrival, the victim described the two suspects as a dark skinned male with braids wearing a white shirt and a dark skinned female with red pants and a black hoodie. The suspect also stated the suspects were last seen walking on Harvard Ave. I responded to 60 Harvard and spoke to Ptlm [REDACTED] who advised me of the following:

Ptlw Fonseca and Ptlm [REDACTED] responded to the area of Harvard and observed two suspects matching the description in front of 60. Both officers exited their vehicle and approached the two suspects. As the officers exited their vehicle, several other subjects on scene became hostile and uncooperative. The female suspect, later identified as [REDACTED] was wearing red pants and a black shirt. Russell, who was sitting inside of a vehicle, was asked by the officers to exit. Ptlw Doldoorian arrived on scene and started to conduct a pat down of Russell. At this time, a female later identified as Sakiesha Russell DOB [REDACTED] 77 became irate and quickly approached Police in an attempt to stop them from detaining [REDACTED]. Ptlw Fonseca used an open hand to prevent Sakiesha with interfering with the robbery investigation along with verbally telling her to step away. Sakiesha then yelled at Ptlw Fonseca saying "Don't touch me bitch." Sakiesha then took a fighting stance with Ptlw Fonseca while pushing her arm away. Ptlm [REDACTED] to prevent a further assault on Ptlw Fonseca and to effect an arrest, deployed one burst of department issued OC to Sakiesha's facial area. Sakiesha was then placed into custody without further incident. Sakiesha was transported to Central Station without incident and charged by Patrol with Disorderly Conduct and Simple Assault.

I attempted to speak to other individuals on scene, but they continued to be hostile. I responded to the cellblock at Central Station and attempted to speak to Sakiesha in the presence of Sgt. Papa. After advising Sakiesha that I was investigating the use of OC spray, she declined to speak to me about the incident.

Ptlm [REDACTED] and Ptlw Fonseca had reason to believe that two subjects in front of 60 Harvard were involved in a robbery and stopped to investigate. In fact, the two subjects were identified in the robbery, but the victim refused to file a complaint. They were immediately met with hostility upon exiting their vehicle. Sakiesha immediately interfered with their investigation, assaulting Ptlw Fonseca and then taking a fighting stance. Ptlm [REDACTED] use of OC almost certainly diffused this situation, to the point where Sakiesha discontinued her aggression and was apprehended without incident. Based on the aforementioned facts, I find that Ptlm [REDACTED] use of OC spray was justified and within policy.

On Friday, September 29, 2017 at 0055 hours police (Car 322, Ptlm Calandra & Ptlm Endres) were dispatched to 571 Broad St, for report of a Robbery. Upon arrival police spoke with the victim [REDACTED] DOB [REDACTED] who made the following statements to police.

[REDACTED] stated that while walking on Harvard Ave a dark skinned male with braids wearing a white T-shirt, and a dark skinned woman, with red pants and a black hoodie approached him and asked for money [REDACTED] stated that he took a dollar out to give to the female. The female then took all the money in his hand (\$13) pushed him and told him to "get out of here". [REDACTED] stated the subjects were last seen on Harvard Ave. Police updated the description of the suspects on PPD channel 1. Sgt McGregor responded to the scene.

Car #323 Ptlw Fonseca and Ptlm [REDACTED] observed multiple subjects in front of 60 Harvard Street. Police approached the subjects and observed two suspects, male and female matching the description of the suspects who committed the robbery. It should be noted that upon arrival all subjects were uncooperative and hostile. Police approached a vehicle outside of the above listed location and observed a female subject later identified as [REDACTED] wearing red pants and a black shirt. Police requested [REDACTED] to exit the vehicle for further investigation. While Ptlw Doldoorian was performing a terry pat another female subject later identified as Sakiesha Russell (DOB [REDACTED] 1977) became irate and approached police during the search. Ptlw Fonseca gave Sakiesha two verbal commands to back away. Sakiesha did not comply and continued to approach Ptlw Doldoorian. At this time Ptlw Fonseca used an open hand push to create distance between police and Sakiesha. Sakiesha said "Don't fucking touch me bitch" and then squared up with Ptlw Fonseca and pushed her hands off of her. At this time Ptlm [REDACTED] deployed one burst of his department issued OC spray. Police then placed Sakiesha in handcuffs without further incident. Sakiesha was transported to Central Station and was held for the next session of 6th District Court. Sakiesha will be charged with Disorderly Conduct and Simple Assault on a Police Officer. Sakiesha was afforded the ability to decontaminate in the cell block.

At this time police were speaking with the other suspect involved who was later identified as David Gomes (DOB [REDACTED] 1976). Gomes first gave the name David Russell but it was later determined that he was providing a false name. Gomes stated to police that he gave the false name due to a bench warrant he had. Gomes was then checked NCIC/Local where it was determined that he had an active bench warrant out of Superior Court. Gomes was transported without incident to Central Station and held for the next session of 6th District Court. Gomes will be charged by the Patrol Bureau for the bench warrant and Obstructing a Police Officer.

As show up was later conducted under the supervision of car 315, Sgt. McGregor. [REDACTED] was able to identify Russell as the subject involved in the incident however she did not wish to press charges and would not respond to Central Station to fill out paperwork. Russell was then released from the scene.

Det. Melaragno (Robbery Squad 10/1/2017)

The victim refuses to cooperate with police in this matter. Detectives will continue to reach out to the victim to further this matter.

Narrative

On 10-10-17 I was summoned by car 312 to 79 Washington Street for a report of an officer use of force incident involving OC Spray with a detail officer. Upon arrival I came into contact with Ptlm [REDACTED] who informed me that there had been a disturbance inside the nightclub involving several females. He further stated a staff member from the club had been physically removing two females from the club later identified as Keegan Buckley (DOB [REDACTED] 95) and McKenzie Buckley (DOB [REDACTED] 92). During their removal both females were attempting to pull away from the staff member and refusing to follow any commands to leave the venue. Once outside, McKenzie Buckley struck one of the bouncers in the head from behind with a fist and continued with a flurry of punches in the direction of the bouncer. At this time Keegan Buckley also began to flail her arms in the direction of the bouncer. Officer [REDACTED] witnessed these actions and began to move in to break up the commotion. As he did, he noticed other female and male individuals had begun to gather around the bouncer and himself, including a subject whom the bouncer later stated had threatened harm to him.

As the disturbance grew, Officer [REDACTED] for his safety and the safety of the security guard, let one large burst of pepper spray go towards the two females involved in the altercation. Once the OC had been deployed, the two female individuals and the male who threatened the bouncer were detained with the assistance of arriving officers. After the burst of spray, the residual mist from the OC blew back in the direction of Ptlm [REDACTED] causing him to suffer minor eye irritation. Once all parties were detained, Officer [REDACTED] was able to determine the both Buckley females were under arrest for assault and disorderly conduct.

While on scene I interviewed Ptlm [REDACTED] who explained the events that unfolded. I also spoke with the head of security who described the events as I stated them above. I also interviewed both female suspects on scene. Keegan Buckley stated to me that she had been involved in a fight inside the club and when ejected, she felt as though the bouncer had unintentionally pulled her shirt up, exposing her breasts during her removal. K. Buckley explained to me she was sorry for the way she had acted and understood why she was being arrested. McKenzie Buckley also explained to me there had been a fight in the crowd in which she and her sister had been involved in. She further acknowledged striking the bouncer, but claimed he had been choking her sister and her breasts were being exposed due to the hold he had on her during removal. M. Buckley expressed remorse for the assault but did acknowledge that it took place. I did notice minor skin irritation to both females' faces and arms. I asked both if they would like medical attention and they declined; only asking to wash their faces and arms when possible.

Due to the large crowd exiting the strand, I was unable to interview the bouncer. However, he did leave a witness statement to the incident as well as a contact phone number. There was also a witness identified as [REDACTED] who came forward to police earlier, but for those same reasons I was unable to interview her. She also provided police with a contact phone number if needed. There is also video surveillance on the premises that I did note if ever needed.

At this time I find that Officer [REDACTED] was well within policy and his use of force during this incident is justified.



On 10/10/17 at 2100 hrs police were assigned to a detail at The Strand, 79 Washington St, for a concert. At approximately 2319 hrs police observed a Strand bouncer, later identified as [REDACTED] physically escorting two females from the building. Police observed the bouncer struggling with the female subjects as they attempted to resist and refuse to exit the building. Upon exiting the building one of the female subjects, later identified as McKenzie Buckley (DOB [REDACTED] 92), struck Holden in the face and continued to flail her arms in [REDACTED] direction until police intervened. The second female subject, later identified as Keegan Buckley ([REDACTED] 95), engaged physically with [REDACTED], pushing and flailing her arms while outside in front of the Strand, yet was not implicated in the assault. During the disturbance police observed the altercation intensify as subjects pushed Holden back towards the entrance. Police then used department issued OC spray and gave one long burst in the direction of both Buckley's striking them in the area of their face. The OC misted in the air and blew back in the direction of Ofc [REDACTED] causing eye and skin irritation. Police were able to apprehend both McKenzie and Keegan Buckley without further incident.

During the investigation of the incident police detained [REDACTED] until it was determined that he was not directly involved in the disturbance.

Police spoke with [REDACTED], who stated to police that he observed McKenzie and Keegan Buckley attack a female subject on the first floor dance floor of the Strand. [REDACTED] then grabbed Keegan and McKenzie Buckley and attempted to escort them from the building. Once outside of the main door McKenzie Buckley punched him from behind and [REDACTED] threatened [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] pointed out to police the subjects responsible for the disturbance and simple assault.

While on scene an employee of the Strand, [REDACTED] came forward and told police that she had witnessed the events of the incident beginning from the foyer to the main exit.

McKenzie Buckley was transported to central station where she was charged by patrol with simple assault and disorderly conduct. Keegan Buckley was transported to central station and charged by patrol with disorderly conduct. Both were held for the next session of court.

Both McKenzie and Keegan Buckley were able to utilize the eye wash in the detention block of central station due to the effects of the pepper spray.

Sgt. Vieira responded to the scene and a use of force inquiry was conducted.

Supervisor Use of Force Inquiry**

Narrative

On 10-10-17 I was summoned by car 312 to 79 Washington Street for a report of an officer use of force incident involving OC Spray with a detail officer. Upon arrival I came into contact with Ptlm [REDACTED] who informed me that there had been a disturbance inside the nightclub involving several females. He further stated a staff member from the club had been physically removing two females from the club later identified as Keegan Buckley (DOB [REDACTED]-95) and McKenzie Buckley (DOB [REDACTED]-92). During their removal both females were attempting to pull away from the staff member and refusing to follow any commands to leave the venue. Once outside, McKenzie Buckley struck one of the bouncers in the head from behind with a fist and continued with a flurry of punches in the direction of the bouncer. At this time Keegan Buckley also began to flail her arms in the direction of the bouncer. Officer [REDACTED] witnessed these actions and began to move in to break up the commotion. As he did, he noticed other female and male individuals had begun to gather around the bouncer and himself, including a subject whom the bouncer later stated had threatened harm to him.

As the disturbance grew, Officer [REDACTED] for his safety and the safety of the security guard, let one large burst of pepper spray go towards the two females involved in the altercation. Once the OC had been deployed, the two female individuals and the male who threatened the bouncer were detained with the assistance of arriving officers. After the burst of spray, the residual mist from the OC blew back in the direction of Ptlm [REDACTED] causing him to suffer minor eye irritation. Once all parties were detained, Officer [REDACTED] was able to determine the both Buckley females were under arrest for assault and disorderly conduct.

While on scene I interviewed Ptlm [REDACTED] who explained the events that unfolded. I also spoke with the head of security who described the events as I stated them above. I also interviewed both female suspects on scene. Keegan Buckley stated to me that she had been involved in a fight inside the club and when ejected, she felt as though the bouncer had unintentionally pulled her shirt up, exposing her breasts during her removal. K. Buckley explained to me she was sorry for the way she had acted and understood why she was being arrested. McKenzie Buckley also explained to me there had been a fight in the crowd in which she and her sister had been involved in. She further acknowledged striking the bouncer, but claimed he had been choking her sister and her breasts were being exposed due to the hold he had on her during removal. M. Buckley expressed remorse for the assault but did acknowledge that it took place. I did notice minor skin irritation to both females' faces and arms. I asked both if they would like medical attention and they declined; only asking to wash their faces and arms when possible.

Due to the large crowd exiting the strand, I was unable to interview the bouncer. However, he did leave a witness statement to the incident as well as a contact phone number. There was also a witness identified as [REDACTED] who came forward to police earlier, but for those same reasons I was unable to interview her. She also provided police with a contact phone number if needed. There is also video surveillance on the premises that I did note if ever needed.

At this time I find that Officer [REDACTED] was well within policy and his use of force during this incident is justified.
