

Beloved Partners in Ministry,

Welcome to Advent! The season of Advent marks the beginning of a new liturgical year. This Advent our church is also kicking off a new denominational initiative as we attempt to answer the call to become a Matthew 25 church. Matthew 25:31-46 may be a familiar passage to many. It calls all of us to be actively engaged in the world around us, displaying our faith through our actions

and how we treat our neighbors. Briefly, it tells of Jesus receiving into the kingdom those who in life had shown him compassion by feeding him, giving him water, welcoming him, clothing him, caring for him when he was sick, and visiting him in prison. Shocked, the righteous do not remember doing any of these things for Jesus, to which he replies, "I assure you that when you have done it for one of the least of these siblings of mine, you have done it for me."

These words from Matthew 25 will serve as our focal point for 2020: serving others IS serving Christ. The PC(USA)'s initiative invites churches to be involved in one of three areas: 1- Building congregational vitality, 2- Dismantling structural racism, or 3- Eradicating systemic poverty. Our Session has chosen to focus on systemic poverty. We are already at work meeting the needs of some of our neighbors who are experiencing poverty or food insecurity. We support our own food pantry and Niles Community Services (NCS) which does a lot of work in this area. One question that we don't often think about when we donate food, or pack grocery bags to hand out to those in need is, "Why?" Why is there such a great need? Why do hundreds of people walk through the doors of NCS every month to get help with groceries? Once we start to learn about the reasons behind systemic and generational poverty, we can then begin to ask another important question, "What am I going to do about it?"

Throughout the year we will have many opportunities to engage with our neighbors and learn about our community. Two such opportunities are coming up in the next six weeks. First, we are hosting a free community breakfast on December 14th for anyone who wishes to come and eat. I invite you to come and sit with someone that you do not know, to introduce yourself, and engage in conversation with your neighbor. This may feel scary (especially if you are an introvert like me!), but I promise that your time spent in conversation will prove rewarding.

Your second opportunity to get to know your neighbor and how we can better serve our community comes on January 11, 2020. We will be hosting a panel discussion with community leaders who will help us better understand the people who live around us. You can find more information about this event inside this newsletter. Please plan to join us...there will be food!

Living a life of service to others is one of the main reasons that I feel called to ministry and I am excited about the possibilities of walking this path with all of you! May we all fully embrace our calling to be a Matthew 25 congregation, a people ready to serve the image of God found in every person we meet.

Just a reminder as the year comes to a close, December is the last month to ensure pledge contributions to the church are up to date. Through November, we are operating at a \$3985.17 deficit for the year. The church leadership has taken action this year to support the general fund in other ways than the contributions from its members. We have hosted 4 separate fundraisers that have supplemented the general fund by approximately \$5000.

Please remember that in order for our church to continue to do all the great things it does for mission and the community that we need our members to support it financially. We understand that this year has brought financial setbacks to our community with the closing of General Motors and other area businesses and pray that 2020 will bring new beginnings and opportunities to our community.



The Christmas Joy Offering of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) assists leaders and their families—past, present, and future. The offering supports church workers and their families who have retired, those who continue their ministry, and those who will be our future leaders. Each of us gives thanks to someone who points us to God and the gift of Jesus in our lives.


