From St. Paul's First Epistle to the Hebrews

Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need. For every high priest taken from among men is appointed for men in things pertaining to God, that he may offer both gifts and sacrifices for sins. He can have compassion on those who are ignorant and going astray, since he himself is also subject to weakness. Because of this he is required as for the people, so also for himself, to offer sacrifices for sins. And no man takes this honor to himself, but he who is called by God, just as Aaron was. So also, Christ did not glorify Himself to become High Priest, but it was He who said to Him: "You are My Son, today I have begotten You." As He also says in another place: "You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek".



To the members of the All Saints Camp community: Glory to Jesus Christ! Glory forever to God!

We are very excited as always about the upcoming summer camp season. As you know, the health and safety of campers and staff is of the utmost importance to the leadership of All Saints Camp. With Coronavirus on everyone's mind, we wanted to let you know what steps we are taking to ensure that we are prepared before your camper arrives. Although this is a very fluid situation, at this point in time we are optimistic that we should be able to continue with preparations for the summer.

First, we are remaining informed by receiving timely updates from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as well as from the Pennsylvania Department of Health. We understand that there are many different unverified sources of information about Coronavirus online, however, these sources are sometimes not based on science and may be unintentionally alarming. For the most accurate and up-to-date information, we are relying on only official sources as well as through the professional guidance offered by the American Camp Association, the Association of Camp Nursing, the American Academy of Pediatrics and local health officials. Links to these resources are included below.

Second, our leadership and medical staff are reviewing all of our on-site protocols in light of the recent events. We have a communicable disease plan in place that will be revised in cooperation with public health authorities as additional COVID-19 guidance is provided. We are in contact with the local

public health department to maintain effective protocols for the identification and appropriate treatment of any illnesses that may occur at camp, including COVID-19. We are also confident that our past experience dealing with similar issues that have affected our All Saints Camp community over the years will serve us well as we prepare for any contingencies that may arise.

It is understandable to be concerned and have questions as this is a rapidly evolving situation. We will continue to update you as important new information comes to our attention in the coming weeks and months.
