It took a lot of runway to get the Cub off the ground and a surprisingly long time to meet our current suggested altitude (1'400) before departing the pattern before turning south for destination. I believe, I recall short of 2'000 over Belvidere, then getting some help from local terrain for 2'500 onto UKT.
