I want to focus on the last item. Calling the Republican support for voter-ID a partisan issue is pure hypocrisy. The professor's reaction is equally partisan – perhaps even more so. Election ID opposition actually goes one better. It not only has the odor of partisanship, it is convincingly mired in partisanship and political vote acquisition strategy.
