
Landscaping Update

One part of our "Blessing the Past, Building the Future" capital campaign involved improved landscaping. A Landscape Committee met in the fall to investigate needs and recommend options. The trustees have approved options recommended by the committee. This includes:

- Shrubs will be trimmed and hedge will be cut back significantly.
- All trees will be pruned to remove dead limbs and improve health and light filtration.
- Lindens in back of church will be pruned to improve building clearance.
- Underdeveloped shrubs around the lindens will be removed and replaced with hostas.
- Hostas will be planted on west side of building around the library door.
- Two ash trees will be treated for emerald ash borer prevention.
- Ground will be graded and grass seed then planted in order to improve drainage from curved portion of sidewalk to the south of front steps.
- Native prairie will be introduced in the south portion of the buffer strip at the east edge of the property.

Dan's Landscape will do all of this work, with the exception that members will donate hostas and we will plant hostas ourselves.

One of the original hopes of the capital project was to add a water garden near where the hedge is. As it turned out, the proximity to the building made this a less than ideal location for a water garden. The introduction of a prairie area will help to beautify a "problem" area of the grounds and also allow for the addition of native plantings and some measure of stormwater runoff mitigation.





Housing First is a strategy to address long-term homelessness among persons with mental illness. Housing First means providing stable, long-term housing with no preconditions to the most vulnerable of the homeless population with mental illness. Often, such persons are required to go through therapy, go through a treatment program, be employed, go through a stay in transitional housing, or meet other criteria before they qualify for public housing. Experience shows that when a person has housing first, all of the other issues facing a

person are much easier to address.

Housing First projects in many communities around the country have shown much better outcomes for individuals in terms of health, quality of life, staying in housing, and more, while saving taxpayers a significant amount of money. In Charlotte, NC, for example, a Housing First program saved \$1.8 million in public money over one year through fewer emergency room visits, fewer hospitalizations, less jail time, less police time and resources, etc. This was a savings to taxpayers of \$29,000/person. Similar results have been found in other programs, including in Des Moines.

Ames Police Department Mental Health Advocate Julie Saxton has identified 12 individuals who are long-term homeless with mental illness and who take up an inordinate amount of public resources. The AMOS Research Team is currently researching the cost of public resources for these people as part of developing a proposal for a Housing First Strategy in Story County.

At the fall AMOS Assembly, the proposal for a Housing First Strategy in Story County was presented. All elected officials who were present endorsed our proposal. Each AMOS institution is collecting signatures to show support for such a strategy while a detailed proposal is being developed.

As an AMOS member institution, we hope to collect 70 signatures from First Baptist. A large poster with a statement of support is on the wall in the Fellowship Hall. If you have not already signed and would like to, please do so by the end of this month as we will turn in our posters in early February. (You do not have to be an "official" church member, over 18, or a Story County resident to sign that statement - this is simply a way of showing that folks in our church support the idea).
