EXETER-WEST GREENWICH, RI - EWG Youth Soccer Academy players Eli Beltran and Noah Santos have been called in to NE Revolution Training Center (RTC). In addition, the other eight Academy players have been presented with an opportunity to show off their skills at the U.S. Soccer Developmental Academy (DA) training session at Bayside FC, RI. This marks the first time these players have been called into the RTC and DA programs while playing for EWG Youth Soccer Academy. During the training the players were able to compete against among New England top elite players in their age bracket.

The Revolution Training Center is an invitation only player identification and player development opportunity that allows New England's top youth talent to supplement current club training with high-level instruction that's consistent with Revolution Academy training sessions. Conducted by members of the Revolution Youth Teams coaching staff, as well as a number of full-time Revolution Academy coaches, the fully-funded program is designed for the region's top players, ages 10 – 15, who are not already on the roster of any U.S. Soccer Development Academy clubs. The program is part of the Revolution Academy's effort to identify and develop young players from the region. Many players who have participated in Revolution Training Centers have been invited to play for the Revolution Youth Teams.

The Development Academy Program follows a comprehensive review of elite player development in the United States and around the world. The Academy Program's philosophy is based on increased training, less total games, and more meaningful games using international rules of competition. The Academy Program focuses on positively impacting everyday club environments to assist in maximizing youth player development across the country. The Academy values individual development of elite players over winning trophies and titles. The Academy sets the standard for elite environments for youth soccer clubs nationwide and is a part of U.S. Soccer's global leadership position in youth soccer that will impact thousands of players.
