

- Speaker:** Dr Penny Wilson, Field Director of the joint Durham University/Egypt Exploration Society/Supreme Council of Antiquities project at Saïs (Sa el-Hagar),

- Topic:** “Hedgehog Boats, healing ointment and Delta Religious Practice”

The talk will focus upon the question of whether the north of Egypt and the Egyptian Delta had a ‘different’ religious culture to Upper Egypt that can be detected through archaeological material and texts. The talk aims to disentangle and separate the north from the south of Egypt in order to see to what extent our perception of the north is a fictional idea.

The SSAE was formed in 1992 and is aimed at people in the Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire and south Yorkshire areas with an interest in Ancient Egyptian history and art.
