



The Church of Saint Cecilia

In later September, the Community Building Team will provide you the opportunity to sign up for various ministries to fulfill our commitment to our mission statement. Today's focus is on the Liturgical Music ministry.

Sacred song forms a necessary and integral part of the solemn liturgy.¹ Within the gathered assembly, the role of the congregation is especially important.² The full and active participation by all the people is the aim to be considered before all else.³ Singing is one of the primary ways that the assembly of the faithful participates actively in the Liturgy.⁴ As our predecessors did, we take part by singing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs with gratitude in our hearts to God.⁵ The quality of our participation in such sung praise comes less from our vocal ability than from the desire of our hearts to sing together of our love for God.⁶ This common, sung expression of faith within liturgical celebrations, strengthens our faith when it grows weak and draws us into the divinely inspired voice of the Church at prayer.⁷

The whole assembly is actively involved in the music of the Liturgy. Some members of the community, however, are recognized for the special gifts they exhibit in leading the musical praise and thanksgiving of Christian assemblies. These are the liturgical musicians. Liturgical musicians are first of all disciples, and only then are they ministers. Joined to Christ through the Sacraments of Initiation, musicians belong to the assembly of the baptized faithful; they are worshipers above all else. Like other baptized members of the assembly, pastoral musicians need to hear the Gospel, experience conversion, profess faith in Christ, and so proclaim the praise of God. Musicians who serve the church at prayer are not merely employees or volunteers. They are ministers who share the faith, serve the community, and express the love of God and neighbor through music.⁸

The role of music is to serve the needs of the Liturgy and not to dominate it, seek to entertain, or draw attention to itself or the musicians. However, there are instances when the praise and adoration of God leads to music taking on a far greater dimension. At other times, simplicity is the most appropriate response. The primary role of music in the Liturgy is to help the members of the gathered assembly to join themselves with the action of Christ and to give voice to the gift of faith. Music does what words alone cannot do. It is capable of expressing a dimension of meaning and feeling that words alone cannot convey.

Of all the sounds of which human beings, created in the image and likeness of God, are capable, voice is the most privileged and fundamental. Musical instruments in the Liturgy are best understood as an extension of and support to the primary liturgical instrument, which is the human voice. Sacred song is a response which engages the whole self in prayer and unites the faithful in common prayer wherever they gather for worship.

FAITH FORMATION

Sunday Forum—Sept 10th/11:15am How to Learn the Art of Accompaniment Presenter Bill Huebsch

Pope Francis has had a lot to say to the church and the world over the past few years, but there is no pastoral strategy he has emphasized more than pastoral accompaniment. In this he stands in the heart of Catholic Christian tradition as old as the walk to Emmaus or that journey to Caesarea Philippi when he asked his companions who they thought he was. In this brief session we will consider the principles and practices of Accompaniment as they are presented by Pope Francis and the church. We will find that, as we learn to accompany others, we open the door for many who felt they were edged out of church life. Bill Huebsch holds an MTS from the Catholic Theological Union of Chicago. He is a member of St Cecilia's, and has been a writer, a teacher, the president at 23rd Publications, a college professor, and a spiritual director. He is on the adjunct faculty at the Institute for Pastoral Studies at Loyola University Chicago. Bill has published more than 30 books and booklets on spirituality and ministry including The Art Accompaniment.
