Though it is still March, it feels like May and the gardeners are itching to work the soil. Please be careful. You can plant cold weather crop such as Methi (Fenugreek), Lettuce, Spinach or Onions. If you want to start plants (such as Tomato, Pepper, etc.) from seeds, it is the time to get started. Trim your roses to 15"-18" and keep only strong 4 or 5 branches.
