Letter from the President

Exciting news for CHCA and Crescent Hills Park. The Civic Association will receive a \$1,000 stimulus grant relative to losses that occurred because of Covid. Three cancelled luncheons and two cancelled picnics caused a shortfall in our budget. We applied for Stimulus Funds to compensate for this loss, and Mayor and Council granted the application.

While that grant closes the gap, membership fees received to date are still short of the \$2,500 needed to fund CHCA activities. Two activities alone, quarterly newsletters and the Frankstown Rd. sidewalk, cost \$1,000. You are an amazing group of generous people, but we can do better. Increase membership!

The park's budget of \$7,000 is much larger than that of the Civic Association. Park expenses are unpredictable as an aging tree can cost thousands to remove. The Challenge Fund for this year allowed us to double the first \$2,800 of contributions. One generous Springdale household donated \$1,000. Donations by eighty-four households brought that total to \$7,400. But we are a neighborhood of six hundred households. We cannot count on future challenge funds or stimulus grants. We must count on all of you. If you have not already contributed to the park or paid your 2022 membership dues, please join this neighborhood effort to maintain our park and support our activities.
