I want to say thank you to the congregation for the very generous monetary gift. That was so gracious of you. I appreciate even more the love and support and encouragement that it represents.

I also appreciated Mindy and Emma putting together a slide show for the occasion. There were many great memories as well as documentary evidence that I once had red hair! Back when I started at FBC, we were in a different photographic era. The very first phone with a camera was released that year, and it is doubtful that anyone reading this had one of those phones. (In fact, a good number of us did not have cell phones). Digital cameras were the latest tech device – and pricey. I remember when we used actual slides for slide shows – we have come a long way!

That first fall we were in Ames, Y2K was all the talk. Would there be a complete computer meltdown with the new year, since computers were not programmed to roll over to the year 2000? As it turned out, our computers did just fine. Maybe the bigger story was: How many people live to see the start of a new millennium? We actually had a Millennial Service on the first January of 2000, with readings and music from the last thousand years of church history, from St. Francis to Julian of Norwich to Martin Luther to Martin Luther King, Jr.

So much has happened since then - in our community, in the culture, in the world. It can almost make your head spin just to think about it. (Among other things, some of you were born!) And a lot has happened in our church.

# **Great Day of Service**

On Sunday, October 6, we will have our annual Great Day of Service. On this Sunday, we will have a brief service in the sanctuary and then participate in service projects – we will worship through our service.

This day is World Communion Sunday, and our brief service will include communion. As we most often do, we will serve one another the communion elements.

Our projects will take place both in the building and in the community:

- "Make Campustown Shine" we will be picking up litter in the neighborhood.
- Infant blanket project we will be making fleece blankets that will be given to newborns at Primary Health Care, a clinic in Ames for those who are uninsured or underinsured.
- **Hygiene Kits for Church World Service** we will put together kits that will be distributed around the country and around the world to refugees and victims of natural disasters. You can sign up to bring some of the needed items.
- Our younger children may go to visit and sing for homebound seniors.

We will end the day with a simple meal together at noon. For those on Zoom, we will have a few suggestions of things you can do at home.

We have a part in Global Servant <u>Ricardo Mayol-Bracero</u>'s ministry, as he serves and stands alongside communities in Latin America trying to access clean water and air.

We support <u>Deliris and Moise Carrión-Joseph</u>, who serve among Haitian, Central American, and African migrants who have made their new home in Tijuana, Mexico. Moise is a business entrepreneur, and Deliris is a pastor and occupational therapist.

## Barbara Woods Inducted into Iowa African-American Hall of Fame



Dr. Barbara Woods came to Ames and Iowa State as a graduate student in Home Economics. She received her Ph. D. in 1981 and never left. Barbara worked with Iowa State Extension and Outreach until retiring last year.

Barbara served as special projects manager with ISU Extension and was an adjunct professor of human development and family studies at Iowa State University. She was credited with bringing county extension offices "into the computer age." In her work she traveled the state and beyond to improve the lives of Iowans and all Americans.

Barbara first came to our church at the invitation of a co-worker who was a church member and has served our church in many ways over the years. She is currently our church moderator. She has volunteered with Habitat for Humanity for many years and spent countless hours working on service projects with her sorority. She has been a leader in many charitable and justice-focused efforts in Ames and beyond, working to make the world a better place for everyone. She has participated in numerous mission trips with our church and served as a part of many regional mission teams to

Nicaragua, serving with an ABC ministry that helps to provide health care to remote villages.

Barbara received the Distinguished Service Award from ISU Extension and Outreach in 2011 and received that same award from the American Association of Family and Consumer Sciences in 2016. She also received the Career Achievement in Outreach Award from the College of Human Sciences in 2017.

For all of her contributions to the state of Iowa and beyond, she was inducted into the Iowa African American Hall of Fame in a ceremony on September 21. Congratulations, Barbara on a well-deserved honor!
