A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to approve the Consent Agenda as listed above.

REGULAR AGENDA

ORDINANCES

Township Auditor T. Ferry presented an overview of the 2017 Hampton Township Annual Budget. He explained that the municipal tax levy increase is 0.74%, which is well below the State permitted cap of 2%.

Hampton Township’s FY 2017 tax rate is .005%, which equates to \$5.00 per \$100,000 of the assessed home value. Mr. Ferry explained that neither the area schools nor the county have established a tax rate for FY 2017. As a result, he estimated both to be at 2%, which is the State tax levy cap. The 2% rate is subject to change.

PUBLIC HEARING AND FINAL ADOPTION

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP 2017 ANNUAL BUDGET

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay to introduce at first reading the Hampton Township 2017 Annual Budget.

SUSSEX COUNTY LEAGUE OF MUNICIPALITIES REORGANIZATION

Township Auditor T. Ferry stated that he is the new Treasurer of the Sussex County League of Municipalities, which is in the process of reorganizing. They will hold a meeting at the Mohawk House on May 18, 2017. Sparta Councilwoman C. Quinn is organizing the event. Newton Councilman D. Flynn is the new liaison to the New Jersey League of Municipalities. Mr. Ferry invited Hampton Township officials to attend.

RESOLUTIONS

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to adopt the following resolution.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP RESOLUTION SELF-EXAMINATION OF HAMPTON 2017 BUDGET

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5, the Township of Hampton has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local government Services, and the Chief Financial officer has determined that the local government meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 20__ budget year.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Township of Hampton that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & 7.6b and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
 - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
 - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
 - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
 - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
 - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
 - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes.

2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).

3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.

4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated,
 - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
 - c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.

5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.

6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution will be forwarded to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services upon adoption.

WHEREAS, effective child abuse prevention programs succeed because of partnerships among families, social service agencies, schools, religious and civic organizations, law enforcement agencies and the business community;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Township Committee of Hampton Township, Sussex County does proclaim April as Child Abuse Prevention Month, and calls upon all citizens, community agencies, faith groups, medical facilities, and businesses to increase their participation in our efforts to support families, thereby preventing child abuse and strengthening the communities in which we live.

NEW BUSINESS

NANCY SHAY – REQUEST TO HOLD EVENT ON MARCH 28TH SPONSORED BY THE ASPCA LOCATED AT 104 HALSEY ROAD

Ms. N. Shay presented information regarding an event that she is planning on April 23, 2017 at the above reference address from 12:00 P.M. through 5:00 P.M. Approximately 100-150 people are expected to attend. A field in the back of the property will be used for parking purposes. Three retirees police officers will provide traffic control and security. Ms. Shay intends to contact the local fire department to request assistance.

The purpose of the Help-a-Horse Event is to help the horse sanctuary on Halsey Road, as well as bring awareness to the therapeutic value that horses can bring to people coping with autism and PTSD.

Ms. Shay assured township officials that the horse farm has insurance and the policy is up-to-date.

BETH STYLER BARRY – PRESENT TO DISCUSS THE NATURE CONSERVANCY’S HYPER HUMUS RESTORATION PROJECT

Ms. Styler-Barry presented information regarding the Hyper Humus Restoration Project. A private donor will fund the project completely for the next three to five years. Project organizers are currently in the fact-finding stages. Their goal is to repair damage in the Hyper Humus-Paulinskill area that resulted from decades of peat mining in the early 1900’s.

The mining activity opened many of the waterways in the area. The Nature Conservancy is collaborating with conservation groups such as the New Jersey Federation of Sportsmen and Ducks Unlimited to help determine how to best utilize the water. Plans also include reconnecting the flood plan and re-establishing native plants that were destroyed.

Township Administrator E. Klose asked Ms. Styler-Barry to keep her apprised of the project status and provide her with future meeting dates. Ms. Sylter-Barry agreed to do so and thanked township officials for their time.

THE LAND CONSERVANCY – AGREEMENT FOR AN HOURLY FEE FOR CONSULTING SERVICES - \$90.00 PER HOUR

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that she contacted The Land Conservancy at the request of the Township Committee to discuss a consulting agreement with an hourly rate. She noted that a property owner in Hampton Township has expressed an interest in preserving their parcel of land. The Land Conservancy indicated that the project would involve approximately five hours of consulting services.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman K. Gourlay and seconded by Committeeman S. MacKenzie, with all members in favor, to authorize an agreement with The Land Conservancy for Conservation Consulting Services at a rate of \$90.00 per hour.

REQUEST FROM NATHANIAL SAJDAK RE: TOWNSHIP DPW ASSISTANCE FOR EXPANSION OF RAIN GARDEN INFRASTRUCTURE

Mayor P. Yetter stated that the Township DPW assisted with the initial Rain Garden Project at McKeown School last year. The Project Manager, Mr. N. Sajdak, is in the process of planning a project that would expand the garden’s infrastructure. He requested the help of the Township DPW, however, the scope of the work will be much smaller compared to last year.

A MOTION was made by K. Gourlay and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to authorize the Township DPW to assist with excavation work related to the expansion of the Rain Garden infrastructure at McKeown Elementary School.

MUNICIPAL SOFTWARE, INC.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman K. Gourlay and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to approve an upgrade Hampton Township's Network with Sonicwall Wireless Access for \$750.00.

CAPITAL EQUIPMENT

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to have Township Attorney F. McGovern prepare a Request for Proposal for a Ford-F550 Dump Truck for the Township Public Works Department.

APPOINTMENTS TO THE HAMPTON TOWNSHIP RECREATION COMMITTEE

A MOTION was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Committeeman S. MacKenzie, with all members in favor, to appoint George Hudak to the Township Recreation Committee to fill an unexpired term of Member Jim Cutler and to appoint Katie Rotondi as an Alternate #1 Member.

CLOTHING BINS IN HAMPTON TOWNSHIP

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that Township Recycling Coordinator K. Hansen contacted her to discuss unregulated clothing bins located throughout the township's commercial district. The township is missing recycling tonnage due to the lack of bin oversight.

Committeeman D. Hansen stated that the garbage hauler reported that the bins generated 100,000 tons of recycled clothes last year in Hampton Township. There are approximately 30 bins located in the municipality.

Township Administrator E. Klose explained that the Recycling Tonnage Grant Application, which the township submits to the NJDEP annually, awards funding based on recycling tonnage calculations.

A MOTION was made by Mayor P. Yetter and seconded by Committeeman D. Hansen, with all members in favor, to have Township Administrator E. Klose research the matter further.

HAMPTON TOWNSHIP FIRE AND RESCUE UPDATE

HTVFR Chief D. Gunderman reported that HTVFR Volunteers responded to 10 fire calls and 13 EMS calls in the month of March.

Chief Gunderman requested authorization from the Township Committee to allow Member Amy Brahs to operate Vehicle #4851 & 4852.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman T. Dooley and seconded by Mayor P. Yetter, with all members in favor, to authorize HTVFR Member Amy Brahs to operate HTVFR Vehicle #4851 and #4852.

PUBLIC SESSION

Township resident and business owner Mr. S. Martin stated that the clothing bins are a nuisance and tend to be garbage collection sites. He stated his support of a Township Ordinance to alleviate the problem.

Township resident Ms. K. Rotondi asked if there were any updates regarding the graffiti on the train trestle located on Newton-Swartzwood Road. Committeeman S. MacKenzie responded that the meeting scheduled between local and state representatives to discuss matter was postponed.

Township Administrator E. Klose stated that she continues to keep Sherwin Williams Paint apprised of the situation because eventually they plan to strip down the old paint and cover the trestle with a porous material that will act as a base canvas for a possible mural.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to go back into Regular Session at 8:30 P.M.

Township Planning Board Attorney R. Morgenstern stated that he received a proposed amendment to the Zoning Ordinance and Affordable Housing Agreement from 15 Route 206, LLC Attorney J. Kantowitz at 4:30 P.M. today. Mr. Morgenstern stated that the Township Committee has not had adequate time to review the amendments; therefore, they are not prepared to make a decision concerning this matter until a later date.

Mr. Morgenstern stated that Pio Costa Enterprises, LLC would like the Township Committee to consider permitting the construction of 4-story buildings. Mr. Morgenstern explained that 15 Route 206, LLC made the same request and their request was denied. Due to fire safety issues, township officials had stated a preference for limiting the height of structures to 48' with a 17.5% set aside.

A MOTION was made by Committeeman D. Hansen and seconded by Committeeman K. Gourlay, with all members in favor, to limit the height of residential structures to 48', with a 17.5% set aside on the Pio Costa land parcel.


