Clinic Report

January 20th was the night that we held our technical clinic for the first time since the suspension of these meetings due to Covid precautions. We have been very fortunate to have Lois Agrimson step forward and offer the club a meeting place that she is personally donating. Her husband Russ was a fixture at these clinics and Lois and Russ have been enthusiastic and hardworking members making the club the success that it is. This is a very honorable way that Lois has chosen to remember her recently deceased husband.

I was unsure if I would attend, it was a very cold night, and the location wasn't as central as the St. Michaels Church we previously met at. To my great surprise we had attendance that night of at least 35 people and maybe even 38. The format was familiar, so were many of the faces although you only saw about half a face as many people were masked and practiced good distancing. It was a good night to again find some way to connect with people who enjoy Model A's and find a social outlet which have been limited for some time now.

The topic was metal valve stems, the original inner tubes came this way and are quite distinctive in their look. We were led thru the process of taking a modern tube and removing the existing rubber modern stem and then using the unique hardware to attach a non leaking period correct stem. It is possible to purchase an already attached metal stem from an antique tire supplier or parts dealer but as we were shown the process, it is not that difficult and does not require anything special in the way of tools to do your own..

Dale Pomerleau ran this presentation using visual references that have been published in the various national magazines and related his experiences when he did these on his own car.

Jerome Bokelmann worked the audio and visual equipment for the presentation, he brought his own equipment not knowing what would be required to service the needs of the group that night. Jerome's technical experience allowed the presentation to be enjoyed by everyone.

We had a couple come that were interested in joining TCMAFC and they received an application and filled it out.

Next month we will again meet in Eagan at the Christ Lutheran Church located at 1930 Diffley Rd on February 17th. Please consider attending and help start the return to the "good old days"
