## Quilters Guild of East Texas Minutes of Meeting June 14, 2018

The meeting of the Quilters' Guild of East Texas was held at First Christian Church, Thursday, June 14, 2018. President, Cecilia Brannon called the meeting to order at 10:01 a.m. She announced that the scheduled speaker, Fran Snay, would not be speaking. She had thought the meeting was in the evening.

Cheryl Moore made a motion to accept the minutes of the April meeting as printed in the May newsletter, Jerriann Massey seconded the motion. Motion Carried.

The financial report for April was posted at the entrance of today's general meeting. Contact Tana Doss if you have any questions

Marylou Douglas announced there would be a luncheon for new members after the Guild meeting. Thirteen people would attend.

Rhonda Chapman gave a report on upcoming Guild programs and workshops. In July, Jerriann Massey will speak about her 'Fearless Quilting Journey' – Experimenting with different quilting techniques. Her workshop is about collage quilting and there are only 3 spots left. Sandra Archer will speak in August about 'Surviving Antique Children's Quilts.' Alice Willhoit will hold a workshop on Friday teaching Non-traditional Dresden Plate Blocks. Everyone was reminded that the August meeting and workshop was moved up one week. In September Deborah Boschert will speak about 'Captivating Compositions.' In her Friday workshop she will teach her techniques in Art Quilting.

Cecilia told members there were thank you notes from the Christian Women's Job Corp and St. Paul's Children's Foundation for the money they received.

Sheryl Moore reported on 'Sunshine and Shadows' of Guild members. She also gave several tips for quilters.

Karen Walters reported that Cuddle Quilts had recorded 323 volunteer hours from August 2017 to December 31, 2017 and 351 hours From January 1, 2018 to June 14, 2018. There has been 1 quilt kit building party so far. 31 quilts were given to the Salvation Army and 26 quilts were given to Royal Family Kids Camp. During the summer months Quilts will be made for adults and kept until there are enough to give to a women's shelter. In September we will have kids quilts kits to make for the Salvation Army.

Nancy Kemp asked members that are making the Quilt of Valor Mystery Quilts to bring them to the July meeting. She asked members to take some bags of fabric pieces to make blocks for future quilts.

Susan Nelson and Viki Holmquist spoke about the upcoming 2019 Quilt Show. There are two committee chairman positions left to fill: Country Store and Raffle Quilt. Susan encouraged a small group or two people to fill the position of Country Store. If nobody comes forward, there will be no Country Store. The store makes the Guild money that goes toward our speakers and workshops. The Raffle Quilt does not need to be taken to quilt shows as it has not proven to bring in much money in ticket sales. Someone needs to take it to Quilt Shops for hanging and to sell raffle tickets during our Guild's Quilt Show in 2019. Viki announced a luncheon would be held later for committee chairman as a time for planning and coordinating. A Dresden Book was won by Susan Buntz.

Rose Wilson gave door prizes from A Nimble Thimble, Sharman's, and several anonymous donors.

Members showed quilts they made at Show and Tell. The Cuddle Quilt Committee showed quilts that had been completed for Royal Family KIDS Camp. Six quilts and several pillow cases were given to Royal Family Kits Camp.

Meeting adjourned at 10:54 A.M.

## Cuddle Quilts

From August 2017 through December 31, 2017 there were 321 community service hours reported from the making of Cuddle Quilts. There were 351 hours reported from January 1, 2018 through June 14, 2018. Twenty-six quilts were given to Royal Family KIDS Camp. We have several completed quilts and three quilts that need to be quilted, for future giving.

During the summer months we will hand out kits appropriate for young adults to adults. We hope to have many ready to give in the fall to another charity. We hope to contribute to a women's shelter. In September we will begin making quilts for the Salvation Army to give at Christmas.

We thank you for your generous giving of time, fabric and money.

## Library Corner – July

**NEW!** Carol Kile donated a book to the library: Lynn Roddy Brown's *Patchwork-play Quilts*. This book will help you make the most of scraps, spare parts and leftovers.

### Featured Books:

*400 Quilt Blocks* by Linda Causee features traditional quilt blocks that can be made in under 20 minutes. Instructions are given for six, nine, and twelve inch blocks. Seventeen projects are suggested and shown in color. Find this book in RED Piecing & Patchwork under C.

*Pick-A-Pattern Appliqué & Variations* by Joan Waldman shows patterns for making 50 floral arrangements. In addition, pick the setting for your work of art as well as the medium. Find this book in BLUE Appliqué & Embroidery under W.

*Feathered Star* by Barbara Smith makes new quilt designs from an old favorite. You will find a brief description of the 2003 contest from the Museum of the American Quilter's Society with the five award winners and 13 finalists and their quilts. These designs were definitely out of the box. Find this book in GREEN Guides & Techniques under S.

## DEALS or DUDS, June

Rhonda Chapman uses Post-it tabs to mark her rows. She puts the tab on the material in the upper right corner, keeping her rows in order.

Sew Clean is a stain remover made by Bear Thread Designs. This is available at Amazon and also Quilted Joy dot com. This was recommended by someone at the Tyler Modern Quilt Guild retreat in Sunset. According to the info online - Sew clean removes ballpoint pen ink, pencil and crayon marks, lipstick, and make-up, fingerprints. BLOOD, OIL, POUNCE CHALK, and grease, rust stains, coffee and soft drinks, chewing gum and a lot more. At Quilted Joy it comes to around \$19 with shipping. At Amazon it is \$13 if you have a Prime account. I don't know if you can get it locally.

Downy Wrinkle Release – Use this to remove those creases in fabric. Spray it on the crease, iron, and the crease is gone. Be careful with batiks if any wax is still in the material. You can get this locally at Walmart and other stores.

**Update:** Here is the “recipe” if you want to make your own.

- 1 cup water (bottled or distilled recommended if your tap water has a lot of chlorine or a high mineral content, just to be on the safe side)

1 tsp. [liquid fabric softener](#)

1 tsp. [rubbing alcohol](#) (optional, helps the spray evaporate quicker)

Dump the ingredients into a spray bottle with a fine mist nozzle. Give it a shake, and you're ready to go!

Marilyn Hardy introduced some of us to a neat little clip made by Taylor Seville called Magic Clips – the clips you can sew over – 12 clips for \$14.99 at Hobby Lobby. They are also available at Amazon.com. Amazon also has these clips in a larger size.

## **DEFINITIONS**

**MEETING** - The meeting is a gathering of all guild members and guests and meets the second Thursday of each month. We gather at 9:30 AM for a social gathering and the meeting begins at 10:00 AM. Each meeting consists of a business meeting and a program.

**PROGRAM** - Programs are selected by the 2<sup>nd</sup> VP. These programs are presented immediately following the business portion of the Guild meeting.

Programs may be presented by nationally known speakers, speakers not so nationally known or guild members. The program may consist of a lecture, trunk show, slide presentation, and/or a demonstration. These programs are funded by the income from the Guild Quilt Show and dues.

**WORKSHOP** - A workshop is a meeting at which a group of people engage in intensive discussion and activity on a particular subject or project. Workshops are presented by the speaker at the guild meeting. There is a charge for participating in a workshop.
