

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

Parish Council: Meets on the Monday evening after the third Sunday of the month.

# FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

## NEW LEASE OF LIFE

Medicine has really come a long way. Sick people wait for



heart and lung transplants or blood transfusions or some other medical "overhaul" or tune ups. One of our priests has been waiting for a lung transplant for over 10 years. Once a patient gets any of these, they feel this new lease on life. It must be an indescribable experience. The Lenten season can give us this new lease from the

spiritual and psychological perspectives. However, we must be willing to undergo what it takes. Medically, this involves the agonies of waiting for years for your opportunity. Then when you're lucky, you submit yourself to the doctor's knives and the therapist's torturous but healing exercises during recovery. You also change your schedule to accommodate all these new changes and the demands they put on you.

In money language, no one really gets so much by investing very little – except maybe in the lottery.

The Lenten season, when we invest much into it, can infuse

a new lease of life into us. As the psalmist pleads with God, "A clean heart create for me, O God ..." (Ps. 51). This new life will also consist of the fruits of the Holy Spirit as described by St. Paul - love,



joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. To get the best of this season, we should then plan to fully be part of it. We will have to change our schedule to accommodate those checkup visits to Doctor Jesus and His co-workers – Mary, angels, saints, etc. More so, we will have to be willing to submit ourselves to Jesus' operating table. As He tells us, He is the vine and we are the branches. His Father cuts off every branch in us that bears no fruits (John 15:2). Which dead branches and leaves would you like him to prune or cut off for you during this Lenten season?

Here at St. Bart's we have planned some activities to help us enter into the spirit of Lent and come out richly blessed and ready to celebrate the Paschal mysteries. In addition to your personal and family efforts, please plan to join us in these parish celebrations and activities, especially Sunday/ weekday liturgies, Eucharistic adoration, the Lenten mission, the 40-Day novena, donations to the less privileged, Stations of the Cross, etc.

Have a wonderfully blessed Lenten Season.
