# **Congregational Council Mini Minutes for April 2019**

**ATTENDANCE:** All were present with the exception of Diane Boulware, who was excused.

**MEMBER CARE:** Council was asked to get any updates to the church office so that the directory could be printed.

**ADOPTION OF AGENDA:** The agenda for April was adopted with the following additions: Team for Ministry report, Teach team report, Outreach team report, Support team recommendation. IT committee report was added to New Business.

**ADOPTION OF MINUTES:** The minutes for the March council meeting were accepted.

#### **REPORTS:**

Pastor Gina- report received for April.

Treasurer- 2 errors noted, will be corrected by next report. There is a new form for reimbursements/payments for the Ministry teams.

Financial Secretary- report received for March. Pastor's discretionary funds were defined. Executive Committee- recommendations covered under New and Old business.

#### **Team Report/Recommendations:**

- 1. Team for Ministry: Met on March 18th. Will meet quarterly.
- 2. Worship Team: Report received for March meeting.
- 3. Teach Team: Easter Eggstravaganza was held. Approximately 25 children participated, several of which were not members. VBS scheduled for July 21-25.
- 4. Support Team: Recommendations
  - a. The Cemetery committee purchase 100 US veteran grave markers at a cost of \$14 each to be placed on deceased veteran's graves in MHLC cemetery from Flag and Sign Company. This total amount to be taken from the Cemetery fund. Passed
  - b. Archives Committee request the use of the classroom next to current Archives room to expand their space. **Passed**.
  - c. MHLC absorb the cost of those receiving their CDL license to drive church bus not to exceed \$400 with funding coming from Thrivent funds. **Passed**
- 5. Outreach Team: Report received for April meeting. Question asked as to whether MH logo items should be placed in new member's gift bags instead of visitor bags. This will be brought back to Outreach team for discussion.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- 1. Farming Church: Will begin getting small groups together. Webinar will be available to train for this.
- 2. Cemetery: Finance committee reviewing quotes.
- 3. Safety Committee: Committee continuing to work. Council Reps were asked to lock front doors to Sanctuary directly after the service instead of waiting until after Sunday School.

- 4. Parsonage Task Force: Parsonage Study handed out. This report reviewed all options for the parsonage (use as church facilities, rental, selling of property, and selling of home only) as well as expenses and maintenance summary. We have also been contacted by Lutheran Services Carolinas as a possible use for a Recovery House. LSC employee would live in the home along with men participating in the program. More information is being gathered for this. Mt. Tabor has also inquired about the use of the parsonage to house an intern. More information is being gathered on this as well. Will have more discussion on this at May meeting.
- 5. HVAC/Capitol Campaign: Members of the Property Team presented information on HVAC system and their recommendation for replacement. Motion made that we contract with Cullum Services, Palmetto Controls, and Carroll's Electric. **Passed** Finance committee has met with Security Federal to look at options to fund HVAC replacement. Recommendation made that we restructure the current loan to add \$150,000 at 3.99% with the same payment. This would extend the life of the loan only. **Passed.** Recommendation made that we borrow an additional \$50,000 to cover the cost of future projects. **Passed**
- **6.** Terry Swygert and Rebekah Swygert have agreed to serve as Synod Delegates.


#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- New phone system is needed. Property team presented quotes and recommendations for replacement. Recommendation made that we contract with Smith Telephone for replacement of system for a cost of \$1,680. Passed Motion made that the funding from this come from Building Improvement fund. Passed
- 2. Congregational meeting: Letter will be mailed out tomorrow to inform the congregation of meeting on April 28 to vote on HVAC replacement. Will vote on 2 different recommendations: 1. Replace system with financing to come from extending the current loan. 2. Borrow an additional \$50,000 to cover cost of future projects.
- 3. IT committee presented information on renewal of domains coming up in May. Committee reported different options and recommended leaving e-mail as is and moving to a new website builder platform. This is already a budgeted item, so was taken as information only.

After Feedback, the meeting was adjourned with praying the Lord's Prayer.




