#### September 23, 2018 Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Mark 9:30-37

Dear St. Pius X and St. Anthony Church Family,

We know Jesus silenced evil demons (Mark 1:25), he silenced the stormy sea (Mark 4:39), and he even silenced the harassing Sadducees (Matthew 22:34). Today we see Him silence His own disciples after they argue among themselves about who is the greatest. Splendidly, he silenced them by simply asking an innocent question: "What are you all talking about?" Have you ever walked up on a lively conversation and asked 'Hey, what's the topic?", only to hear back crickets chirping! Maybe the silence or diversion is over embarrassment, because all that was being discussed was gossip or a bragging session. Well, that is what is going on with the disciples.

As a kid, we played the game 'King of the Hill', where everyone pushes others down to be the sole one standing at the top of the hill! After victory on top, you raised your hands and yelled, 'I am King of the Hill.' Until, someone pushed you over the other side, and then they were king. Well, the disciples are playing a version of this game, until Jesus silences them. He points out the silliness of humans clinging to power and important titles as a waste of important time and energy. Jesus says in Mark 9:35 "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." And to back his words up with a demonstration, he lifts a child up and says in verse 37, "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me." Jesus is saying, "Lead like me, placing others before your own self. Sacrifice your own needs to serve better and build others up." Doesn't the mere sight of a child put you automatically into a 'service mentality'? Seeing them, you instinctively ask either the parent or child, 'Can I help you?' or 'What do you need?' Jesus is asking His followers to maintain a permanent 'service mindset'! The first question in the disciple's mind should be 'How can I help?', and not 'How do I get ahead-How do I get what I want?' The Christian leader doesn't work to get on top, but instead works below to hold others up. Think of a worldly power pyramid, with the 'boss' at the top point. Jesus takes that pyramid and inverts it so the strongest person is the one underneath the whole stack holding it all up and holding it together. Instead of power up and over others  $\triangle$ , Jesus desires power down and under  $\nabla$  others. Philippians 2:6-7, describes this well. Paul says Jesus, "Who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be clung to. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave." In a sermon once, Martin Luther King Jr, said, "Everyone always wants to lead, everyone talks about 'being the leader'. But everyone overlooks how it begins. If you want to lead, then serve. Being a true leader is as easy as serving." The mark of leadership is the willingness to serve. For us Christians, our leading edge is the service of others. So who is the greatest? The most humble! The unseen worker or the unknown helper are who embody the Kingdom of Jesus.

Jesus addresses this power hunger among his apostles again in Matthew 23:8-10, where he cautions his disciples to beware of 'titles and offices' that can be abused. He advises resistance to conferring an automatic trust just because one is called 'Master, Teacher or Father'. Jesus said, "You are all brothers..... you have one teacher, one Father, and one Master." We do not have to look far at all to see weak leaders who have succumbed to desires of keeping power and 'bossing' demands to others. But Jesus emphatically advised his own disciples never to 'lord authority over others'. In Matthew 20:25-26, He tells us, "It shall <u>not</u> be this way among you." Again, the greatest Christian is the servant, and the first among Christians is the slave! St Paul picked up on this teaching of Jesus when he reminded the Galatians (3:28) to avoid power-distinctions such as class, race, wealth, and sex, that try to justify prejudice and abuse against others. St Paul says, "there is no Jew and Greek, no slave and free, no male and female, all are one in *Christ*". And if we are simply living and going about our work and lives, serving other people in Christ's name, whoever notices such distinctions? It is as easy as serving. Follow Jesus.
