DEACON EZRAS TELLALIAN PUBLISHES <u>"HUMANITY DURING WAR</u>"

Many of you are aware that Ryan Ezras Tellalian had traveled to Artsakh during the war in Nagorno-Karabakh. Ryan has published a book entitled Humanity During War, which is a photographic portrayal of various aspects of civilian life during the 2020 war in Nagorno-Karabakh to the indigenous Armenians. A thirdgeneration Armenian-American descendant of the genocide, Ryan travelled to the war zone to capture the experiences of civilians caught up in an unwanted geopolitical conflict with deep ethnohistorical roots. His photographs, intertwined with simple yet deep descriptions of the people he encountered, give light to typically neglected wartime narratives in which the human drives for life, peace, and love are stronger than the desires to kill, to destroy, and to hate. In an often-overlooked corner of the world, Humanity During War powerfully and personally depicts the toll of daily shelling and displacement on everyday people while acknowledging their resilience and hope. All profits earned by the book will be donated to trustworthy organizations in Artsakh and Armenia that are providing humanitarian and psychological aid in order to address the consequences of the war. THANKSGIVING STORY

Some of the most moving lessons are taught by your students.

When Mrs. Klein told her first graders to draw a picture of something for which they were thankful, she thought how little these children, who lived in a deteriorating neighborhood, actually had to be thankful for. She knew that most of the class would draw pictures of turkeys or of bountifully laden Thanksgiving tables. That was what they believed was expected of them.

What took Mrs. Klein aback was Douglas's picture. Douglas was so forlorn and likely to be found close in her shadow as they went outside for recess. Douglas's drawing was simply this: A hand, obviously, but whose hand? The class was captivated by his image. "I think it must be the hand of God that brings us food," said one student.

"A farmer," said another, "because they grow the turkeys."

"It looks more like a policeman, and they protect us." "I think," said Lavinia, who was always so serious, "that it is supposed to be all the hands that help us, but Douglas could only draw one of them."

Mrs. Klein had almost forgotten Douglas in her pleasure at finding the class so responsive. When she had the others at work on another project, she bent over his desk and asked whose hand it was.

Douglas mumbled, "It's yours, Teacher."

Then Mrs. Klein recalled that she had taken Douglas by the hand from time to time; she often did that with the children. But that it should have meant so much to Douglas ...

Perhaps, she reflected, this was her Thanksgiving, and everybody's Thanksgiving—not the material things given unto us, but the small ways that we give something to others.

Lesson On the Cross – Last Sayings of Our Lord

"*My God, My God, why have you forsaken me*?" are the words recorded in Matthew 27:46 and Mark 15:34.

Loneliness.

Who hasn't experienced loneliness? Or who hasn't experienced it's consequences? Loneliness doesn't mean only living alone and the feeling of abandonment. Even in the presence of others we could fill loneliness because the right person who by his presence could get us out of this loneliness has become unavailable. God also, didn't want to live alone but created man to enjoy his love and presence. When man feared God's presence because of his own sin, God questioned him and said: "Adam where are you?" Similarly, the new Adam, Jesus Christ (even though He is equal to God) emptied himself and took the form of a slave who carried the sins of the whole world and walked to death on the cross.

Only God can fill the life of man and save him from the sharpness of loneliness, especially in suffering. We often seek a person's presence by asking them to not let us alone and be with us because we take our strength from them. We forget that the presence of others is temporary and limited. Everyone is worried about his/her own life and cares more about their interests and priorities in their life. All of this has not escaped His mind, because He knows that His only strength is in God the Father. Therefore, Jesus wanted to be protected by his father's presence during his last hours to complete his plan for salvation. During our pain, we must examine our own consciousness. Who among us doesn't let us down when we need them? If we haven't found Him, we should continue to search. If we have found Him, let's not lose Him from our lives.

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
