AGE REQUIREMENT

Members must be at least in the 9th grade and not more than 12th grade by September 1 of the 2021-2022 4-H year.

MASKS

Per Lakeview Baptist Assembly Covid-19 Guidelines, masks must be worn in the food serving line. Other than that, masks are optional and up to the discretion of the 4-H member and their parent/guardian. See the attached document for more information regarding Covid-19 Protocols.

T-SHIRTS

When registering, all participants (youth and adults) need to indicate the size of the t-shirt preferred. We will distribute those at Registration/Check-In.

DRESS CODE

Dress for the camp is casual, but neat and that follows the 4-H dress code. Athletic or tennis type shoes are preferred.

<u>NO flip-flops or open back shoes</u> – camp is on a hillside with a lot of rocks, making these type shoes dangerous. Water or lake shoes are also recommended.

Bring clothes and shoes appropriate for active sports, swimsuits, water shoes, outdoor recreation, and a dance. Tennis or athletic shoes are required for the Ropes Course. Incoming and Outgoing District Council Officers will need to bring a nice outfit appropriate for the Officer Installation.

Items **NOT** allowed – tops with spaghetti straps, halter type tops, shirts that reveal the bare midriff, excessively loose-fitting pants/jeans, short shorts or skirts, clothing advertising referencing alcohol, drugs, violence or having a sexual content. See-through or muscle shirts are not appropriate for boys at camp. Two-piece swimsuits are **NOT** allowed and girls must wear a t-shirt over their one-piece swimsuit.

WHAT TO BRING

participates (youth and Agents) will be housed in dorm facilities.

The following items are needed:

Pillow, sheets, blanket and/or sleeping bag, towels, washcloths, toiletries, reusable drink bottles, bug spray, sunscreen, and a flashlight.

Card or board games, snacks, and money for camp store for snacks or souvenirs.

WHAT NOT TO BRING

Please do not bring valuable electronic equipment.

Do not bring water guns, water sling shots, shaving cream (unless for personal use), video games, or fireworks.

CELL PHONES

Campers will be asked to leave their cell phones in their dorm rooms during the day and evening activities.
