The instructor Sue Sutherland has studied apparel and textile design manufacturing and has learned to make bunands from Heimen Husflid in Oslo. She travels to Norway to purchase products and to continue her study of techniques and styles from all areas of Norway. If you want to make a bunad and do not yet have the materials please contact Sue Sutherland as soon as possible. The kits and materials need to be ordered soon.

\$40 per month or \$478 per year and it includes a provision that will provide \$2000 per month if she needs chronic illness care.

Or, if you want to pay once and be done, \$5900 for a \$50,000 policy with a \$1000 per month chronic care provision.

For that 40 year-old daughter, a \$50,000 policy would cost \$544 per year.

Is this what they want for Christmas? Probably not but we are grandparents and we get to do what we want at Christmas. Ho, Ho, Ho.


