# November Project

#### Let's paint a snowmen!!


This is a project that you don't have to go out and buy paints for. Use what you have!

It can be painted on any surface. I gave painted on a large tag, a glass block, and a piece I picked up at Hobby Lobby.

Hobby Lobby has a board in their Fall and Christmas crafts that hangs and at 50% off is less than \$2.00.

Base coating is minimal as stated in instructions. Barb based in buttermilk. I used a different color on each sample. Buttermilk, Lt. Buttermilk, White, and Bleached Sand. Use what you have and what you like.

BARBS OXIGINAL PIECE WAS DESIGNED FOR AND PAINTED on an 8 x 8 x 3 Glass Block from the hardware store. Oraft stores now carry a crafters version of these blocks. Hobby Lobby puts them on sale ever few weeks.

My version is pointed on a 10x6 inch wood TAG.

I CAN BE PAINTED on the surface of your choice.

Palette: Americana
Buttermilk, (or L+B+rmlk), CANYON ORANGE, Traditional RAN SIENNA,
Lamp Black, BRIGHT ORANGE, CELERY, ESPRESSO, DEEF BURGANDY,
BURNT SIENNA, TOMATO RED. BURNT UMbel

DO NOT GO OUT AND BUY PAINT! USE the colors you have!


PREP: Base cost with Buttermilk (pounce if on aiblock)
Blocks will require at least a costs of paint.

Edges of block are tomato Red

Tag has a lem edge in Red-

Let dry thoroughly (Brick will need a couple of days to "Cure")
Transfer pattern

Base coat: Nose - Canyon Orange Arms, legs, tree trunk & branches & sucker stick-Raw Sienni Ground and Sucker - White

I would like different members to take photos at the meetings, paint-ins etc. and send to me for the newsletter. It is great to have photos from different members to show different perspectives.


