

As part of our economic development strategy, local periodically review business health and new business opportunities. Neighborhood Beautification funding. Grants:

<u>Purpose</u>

The Clean City of Willoughby Association Inc. believes in building strong neighborhoods, neighborhood pride, community participation and responsibility. The purpose of the Willoughby Neighborhood Beautification Grant Program is to support neighborhoods in their efforts to beautify and improve the community and take ownership of public spaces. This program is designed to help groups of and neighborhood residents organizations both beautify their local environment, and build a stronger community by developing and nurturing relationships among neighbors.

Eligibility

Applications will be accepted neighborhood and community-based groups; groups do not have to be incorporated.

The following organizations and projects are not eligible for

- Organizations or groups that do not represent a specific targeted neighborhood or geographical
- Projects that have already taken place or costs already incurred;
- Neighborhood associations that have received a Neighborhood Beautification grant within the last year.

Funding

Grants range from \$100 to \$500

Grant Priorities

Grants will fund communitydriven initiatives that beautify the neighborhood and enhance public spaces in the community. Funding will support physical improvements including plantings, large-scale clean-ups, community garden improvements, and other beautification projects in public spaces (see project list for more details).

Selection Criteria

We will be looking for projects that meet one or more of the following criteria. We do not expect projects to meet all of these criteria.

- Impact: Impact of project on community
- Capacity: Group or individuals' ability to complete and sustain project
- Community Involvement: Volunteer participation
- Community Need: Need for the project in the community
- Innovation: Innovative solution to a community challenge
- Community Building: Project creates informal community gathering space or brings the community together in some other
- Uniqueness: Project articulates the unique identity of the neighborhood by utilizing local artists or artisans, referencing local history or culture, using local materials etc.

Grantee Responsibilities

• Match 100% of CCWA Grant Award with in-kind donations or volunteer hours.

- Sign an agreement between grant recipient and CCWA. This is required prior to the implementation of the project.
- Submit an expense report along with receipts of the project upon completion.
- Provide CCWA with before and after photos documenting the

- Upon receipt of the Grant Reimbursement Form verification of project completion, Clean City of Willoughby Association Inc. will reimburse the cost of the project (up to \$500) within thirty days. The project must be completed within six months of grant approval.
- There is no deadline for applications. Applications will be accepted as long as funding allows.

years in business. Our downtown has a strong core of communityinvested merchants, restaurants and bar owners.

Unfortunately, occasionally, businesses fail or leave for different reasons such as an increase in rent, poor sales, lack of a business plan. These events are disappointing, but to be expected in small towns with local businesses. As author Paula Jensen states, "People in small towns can stop talking negatively about what things their town has lost or what it used to be like. The changes in the rural Midwest are almost all microcosms of globalization. Rural is changing, not dying." Jensen considers

both small and rural towns of the Midwest to be the same in her analysis. An example of this was the many antique shops located in downtown at one time that left with the declining market demand. In 2019 we saw new investment in our Historic Downtown with the opening of nine new businesses, including Yogi's Closet, Knowtion, My Mindful Market, Pulsart Media, Aware Marketplace, Etc. on Erie, Vidmar Custom Woodworking, D & K Sports, and Bangerter Law Office. We also witnessed a significant expansion of existing businesses Citizens Bank and Young's Sushi. Overall, our downtown has seen steady growth focused on familyfriendly retail and entertainment experiences. In talking with several of our bar and restaurant owners, they indicate the past few months were exceptional with Chaz Bloom of Hook & Hoof stating, "This was our best holiday season. Ever." Furthermore, land values in our downtown are increasing, providing further evidence of our sustainability. With the continued support of our community, local businesses, and our economic development team, we are confident that our Historic Downtown will remain vibrant and thriving.

A new year brings new road construction, and our downtown will see a significant project underway undertaken by the Lake County Department of Utilities. For years we have endured waterline failures on Erie Street causing floods and disruption to our businesses and residents. The

Erie Street waterline replacement will alleviate these issues but will be disruptive. We ask for your patience as the project is underway, and we expect completion of the work by mid-May.



Audubon Reveals Discoveries on Bird Migration Through Cleveland

Audubon welcomes Dr. Andy Jones as he presents "Migration All Around Us: How Birds Navigate the Americas" 7:00 p.m. Tuesday, February 18 at Penitentiary Glen. For some five billion individual birds, a trip to Central or South America from North America is an essential and stunning annual accomplishment. Dr. Jones will explain why birds undertake this grueling trip and how they find their way to wintering grounds they have never seen before. He is the Curator of Ornithology at the Cleveland Museum of Natural History.

Most species of songbirds migrate at night, and lights on tall buildings or aimed at the sky can disorient them and draw them into buildings. This causes many birds to strike windows or circle buildings until they fall from exhaustion. Lights Out Cleveland is the program in this region within the Ohio Lights Out network, which is coordinated by Ohio Bird Conservation Initiative. Ohio Lights Out staff and volunteers assist managers of buildings


that are enrolled in the program to adapt their lighting schedules and modify their buildings' glass to make urban landscapes safer for migratory wildlife, according to https://ohiolightsout.org.

Lights Out Cleveland monitors bird-building collisions during migration. Dr. Jones will present the results of their work, including insights from rehabilitating birds as well as a new discovery from the collision patterns across the



The Lake County General Health District (LCGHD) is now offering a free online opioid overdose prevention training and naloxone distribution through its Project DAWN (Deaths Avoided With Naloxone) program. Participants will receive online training to recognize the signs and symptoms of overdose, distinguish between different overdose types, perform rescue breathing, call EMS, and administer naloxone. The online education and distribution program will be available to Lake county residents, as well as residents of other Ohio counties who do not currently have a Project DAWN program.

The online program is easy to use:

- 1. Visit https://www.lcghd.org/naloxone-distribution/.
- 2. Click the "Request a Kit" link to complete a survey and training video.

LCGHD staff will review all naloxone requests, and mail the naloxone kit to all eligible recipients within 72 hours of the request.

"LCGHD is dedicated to ensuring access to naloxone regardless of one's ability to travel or self-advocate," commented Haley Russo, Health Educator and coordinator of the LCGHD's Project DAWN, an overdose education and naloxone distribution program. The Ohio Department of Health reports that in 2018, 84% of unintentional drug overdose deaths in Ohio resulted from opioids.

Divorce 101:

How to Make Getting a Divorce Fast, Easy and Cost Effective

article simplistically This identifies the main issues in the termination of the marital contract and explains the difference between a divorce and dissolution and why a dissolution is always the best, least stressful and most costeffective means to terminate the marital contract. The issues in either a dissolution or divorce are the same. They are as follows: (1.) Allocation of Parental Rights and Responsibilities, if there are children. The main issues regarding the allocation of parental rights and responsibilities would include who pays child support and how much, companionship time (formerly "visitation"), who has custody or how is shared parenting (formerly "joint custody") to be allocated, who is responsible for health care/ insurance and how will the tax exemption be divided. (2.) Spousal support. Will one party pay the other spousal support and how much and for how long? (3.) Property distribution. How will the marital real and personal property and all other marital assets be divided. (4.) Pension and retirement division, if in existence. And, finally, (5.) Allocation of marital debt. These are the main issues in every divorce and/or dissolution.

The most fundamental difference between a contested divorce and a dissolution is that in a contested divorce the parties cannot agree on one or more of the issues whereas in a dissolution the parties must agree upon the number of issues in the case (listed above). The cost of a dissolution is dramatically less than a divorce (the parties cannot agree on one or more of the issues). The average cost of a divorce with children in Ohio is \$18,800 and without children \$12,500 (Lawyers.com survey). The average cost of a dissolution with children is \$3500 and without children \$2500. Most importantly, the emotional cost of a prolonged divorce is high to both parties and children.

Dissolutions are fast. A dissolution can be finalized in as little as six-weeks from the filing date and, usually, requires only one hearing. An action for divorce- if the parties cannot come to a voluntary agreement- can easily take a year or longer to finalize. There are several hearings and a trial. The information gathering process referred to as "discovery" can become a costly and stressful nightmare. Discovery is not required in a dissolution. In divorce, there is the dread of runaway attorney fees averaging \$250- \$300 per hour. There

is always the worry (which is justified) that the attorney will quit if you run out of money or the fear of receiving another several thousand-dollar bill unexpectedly. Almost everyone has heard a horror story about attorney fees.

are resolved. In most cases, you will not get a better result by engaging in prolonged divorce litigation.

If the parties are unable to come to an agreement regarding all the issues, as is often the case, a divorce must be initiated. I try to resolve as many issues as possible before hand and communicate with the other party or his/her attorney to coordinate the process. It is always best to work together and focus upon resolution of the issues on which the parties agree. The purpose of the attorney is to make the process as minimally painful, and least expensive as possible. Open and honest communication is key. Unfortunately, in many cases, the parties have so much resentment toward each other that they are simply unable to cooperate. This is never in anybody's best interest and can be very damaging to children.

There are certainly ways to minimize the pain and cost of a divorce, but it will never be as efficient and emotionally healthy as two parties coming to a voluntary agreement with dissolution. I believe that a fast, relatively inexpensive dissolution of marriage with minimal stress and pain to the parties and their children is possible in most cases if two factors are present (1.) the parties are mature, sensitive and intelligent and (2.) the matter is approached with a cost versus benefit business analysis, an open mind and sound professional guidance. I know this is easier said than done. But- if accomplished- the financial and emotional rewards (including healing time) reaped are enormous for the parties and children and will be enjoyed for the span of one's entire life.




