RADICAL IDEA - BYOB

Here's a radical idea for St. Paul's every Sunday morning: **BYOB.**(No, not **that** BYOB.) I'm talking the other **BYOB** – as in, *Bring Your Own Bible*. (And no, I didn't invent this little phrase, it's been around quite a while.)

It's kind of ironic that the Protestant Reformation is based on God's Word, but Lutherans aren't particularly known for being a people of the Book. (We leave that to the Baptists.)

That needs to change.

Strong, healthy, growing Christians know how and why God sent His Son Jesus into this world and who they are in Jesus. In order for that to happen, we need to be people of the Book.

If you want more of God in your life and for Him to set a fire down in your soul – you need to spend time with Him and hear Him speak. You need to open the Book!

Understand – like physical health, spiritual health requires discipline and endurance. Even in Christian spirituality: no pain, no gain.

The good news is that Jesus is always present to energize you in your exploration of the Book. He's always ready to help you know Him better. It's not a 'work', it's the empowerment of Jesus to take up and read and get Him deeper in your soul and heart.

What if you brought your own Bible to our Sunday worship? Radical!

- ❖ What if you followed along with the Sunday readings in your favorite translation?
- What if you read the sermon passages in your own Bible and understood them better?
- What if you circled important words? Underlined words? Jotted notes in the margins?
- What if you highlighted key phrases? Or double-checked passages for yourself? As in Acts 17:10-12, The brothers immediately sent Paul and Silas away by night to Berea, and when they arrived they went into the Jewish synagogue. Now these Jews were more noble than those in Thessalonica; they received the Word with all eagerness, examining the Scriptures daily to see if these things were so. Many of them therefore believed.

The Lord has promised us that His Word will always accomplish its purpose. Vitamins do the same thing. However, just looking at the vitamins on the shelf won't do anything for us. You need to open the bottle and start taking them on a regular basis. It's the same with God's Word. You need to crack it open in order to receive who God is really calling you to be in Him.

Pear Lord, heavenly God, for we are surrounded by those who ridicule


You and persecute us. With your will, keep our faith in



A price has not been determined.






VBS and Operation Kid-to-Kid

St. Paul's along with our 2014 Weird Animals VBS raised \$245.00.




Did you know that for just \$2.50, a child in India can have clean water for a year at school!






My faith wavers, Jesus. Sometimes I just don't know if you're real. Maybe this is all a fantasy and after death there's just darkness, nothing.
