You can call them at 716-438-4090 and they will point you in the right direction. You will also need a copy of your discharge papers (DD-214). You can always call me (531-6420) if you are having problems.

Just as a reminder, if you have not already done so, find your discharge papers (DD214) and make about ten copies, because every time you talk about benefits with any VA organization, they are going to ask for a copy.
