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Youth Ministry Guidelines

The purpose of these guidelines is so that our youth group can be a safe place for youth in grades 7th-12th. These Guidelines have been developed to open each other up to God's message and to one another and provides the method to resolve an instance of non-God honoring activity.

Parents and Youth are required to sign this form and return it to church.

Youth:

During the youth ministry meetings, events, and trips under the sponsorship and guidance of **Believers Fellowship Baptist Church**, I recognize that I am a representative of the Christian Community and I am responsible for my actions and the following Guidelines:

- Cursing, cussing, swearing, using God's name inappropriately, racial slurs/jokes/comments, and sexual comments will not be tolerated.
- Do not take your frustration out on others. Recognize that everyone in the youth group is a part of the body of Christ.
- Embrace inclusiveness by helping everyone feel welcome and important.
- There will be no rough housing including hitting, slapping, punching, pushing, and other touching actions that may harm or upset fellow youth.
- The use of the following is absolutely prohibited: tobacco, alcohol, vaping, prescriptions that are not prescribed to you, and illegal drugs.
- The youth room is not your personal dumping ground. Trash is to go in the trashcans. The youth are responsible for keeping the youth room clean. Respect the things used, property and places we visit. The areas use for all church functions, including transportation, are to be left clean.
- Phones are to be on silent and put away during lessons or when a leader is speaking. The exception is when using the Bible app for the lesson.
- No public displays of affection or inappropriate physical contact of any kind while at church functions. If you bring your boyfriend/girlfriend you are not allowed to kiss, sit on each other's laps, or behave in such a way that would make others around you uncomfortable. This detracts from our purpose as we meet together. Youth leaders will model appropriate behavior.
- Follow the rule of three. Youth and leaders should always be in an open area with at least two other people. Do not disappear into vacant rooms or hallways.
- Do not participate in the following behaviors: interruption, bullying, racism, vandalism, physical or emotional violence. Again, recognize that everyone in the youth group is a part of the body of Christ.
- Provide a trusting environment for your peers. When someone shares something personal in a group discussion, do not repeat that information to other friends outside of the group. And when a youth member or leaders ask you to please be quiet, do so right away.
- Take the initiative to inform your guests of their responsibility to follow these guidelines when they visit the youth group.
- Notify a leader immediately if there is inappropriate behavior by another youth so that the leader can help in resolution.

Dress Code:

- Modest, non-revealing clothing must always be worn.
- Shirts:
 - Shirts must be the appropriate size, no exposed midriffs.
 - No insignia that signifies violence, alcohol, tobacco, or drugs.
 - Undergarments are not to be seen (ex: through arm holes, low hanging pants).

- Pants/Shorts:
 - Shorts, skirts, and dresses must be mid-thigh or below. Mid-thigh is defined as the midpoint between the hip and knee. Leggings may be worn if shorts are not long enough.
 - Leggings/yoga pants are permitted only when worn with a top that extends to the mid-thigh or below.
 - Pants and shorts must appropriately cover undergarments.
 - Holes in jeans are permitted below mid-thigh. Leggings must be worn underneath any pants with rips/holes above mid-thigh.
 - Swimming activities:
 - Shorts or swim trunks must be worn at all times with swim wear
 - Guys: must wear a shirt at all times
 - Girls: can wear either a non-revealing one piece, tankini, or a two piece with a shirt

Guidelines for Consequences:

Consequences will focus on restoring peace with reconciliation among the parties involved. The goal of resolving each problem will be growth and learning through repentance and forgiveness. Any problems encountered will be handled within the group and by the adult leaders to the extent that this is possible.

- Should a situation persist or become uncontrollable, the parent/guardian will be contacted and informed of the problem.
- Should the situation continue or be urgent, the parent/guardian will be contacted immediately and will be responsible for arranging to pick up their youth, **excluding ride sharing**.
- If the decision is made to send the youth home, the youth will not be able to attend future events until a resolution has been reached.

Youth and Parent/Guardian Signature:

I understand that the above is not a comprehensive list of actions or behavior but rather an acknowledgement that participating in Believers Fellowship's Youth Group requires a commitment to try to model God's love and respect for self and others.

I have read and understood the guidelines. I have looked over each rule carefully with my parent/guardian. We understand the guidelines and their subsequent consequences. I understand that these guidelines are set forth to make sure that the youth ministry times are fun and comfortable for everyone, including myself.
