Pope Francis held a two-day meeting at the Vatican with leaders of the Ukrainian Greek-Catholic Church, including Major Archbishop Sviatoslav Shevchuk, the members of the Permanent Synod, and the Metropolitans; as well as the heads of discasteries of the Roman Curia with relevant competencies.

In his remarks to the leaders of the Ukrainian

Greek-Catholic Church, Pope Francis acknowledged the "difficult and delicate situation" in Ukraine, which has suffered more than five years of war in its eastern provinces. The Pope noted the so-called 'hybrid' nature of the conflict, "composed as it is of acts of war in which those responsible camouflage themselves; a conflict where the weakest and the smallest pay the highest price; a conflict aggravated propagandistic falsifications and manipulations of various types, also in the attempt to involve in the religious aspect." The Holy Father assured the visiting prelates, "I hold you in my heart, and I pray for you, dear Ukrainian brothers." He said, too, that his prayer goes out for all those affected by the fighting: "I ask of the 'God of all comfort' to comfort the souls of those who have lost their loved ones due to the war: those who bear wounds in their body and in their spirit; those who have had to leave their home and work, and face the risk of searching a more human future elsewhere, far away." In turn, Patriarch Sviatoslav invited the pope to visit Ukraine: "For 5 vears. Ukraine has been a victim of a war. It is not only done with foreign weapons, but also with misinformation, and the distortion of the truth. The Holy Father's visit to Ukraine would be a very eloquent and symbolic way to end this war. Many believe

this, not only Catholics.

GREEK CATHOLICS FACE DIFFICULT TASK OF BUILDING PATRIARCHATE On May 11, while in Philadelphia celebrating the 45th anniversary of the St. Sophia Society of Ukrainian Catholics, Patriarch Sviatoslav remarked on the importance of setting up the patriarchal structures. "It is important that we all join the setup of patriarchal structures because without this it will not be possible to fully comply with the will of Patriarch Iosyp," the Patriarch said. He also remarked on the efforts of his predecessor, His Beautitude Lubomyr in building the Patriarchate.

"28. The parish is not an outdated institution; precisely because it possesses great flexibility, it can assume quite different contours depending on the openness and missionary creativity of the pastor and the community. St. Paul of the Cross was an expert in helping people to connect their experience with Jesus' Passion: "

I will try with all my strength to follow the footsteps of Jesus. If I am afflicted, abandoned, desolate, I will keep Him company in the Garden. If I am despised and injured, I will keep him company in the Praetorium. If I am depressed and afflicted in the agonies of suffering, I will keep him company faithfully on the Mount, and in a generous spirit I will keep him company on the Cross with the lance in my heart. Oh, how sweet it is to die!"

Prayer for Priests

Our life, given us by the Lord, is given in order that we would use it correctly and advantageously. If we didn't have life, than everything else would not have any worth or value. Only in the context of our life everything else can have some kind of value. If God gifted us with life, then He expects us to spend it profitably and bring Him the fruits in our particular state of life. The Lord gave us life, and better said, lent it – handed it to us. In the final analysis, it is not our property, we are only making use of it and some day we will stand

before God to bring its fruits from it. It's similar to that when someone who has a treasure, money, and tries to deposit it in the best way, either in a bank or in a business, in order that the transaction would yield a profit. So it is with our life—it's an enormous treasure. And the question rests is in this, where we are investing it. Inevitably we will invest it. If we invest it correctly, then later in eternity, we will have accrued a profitable yield from this transaction.

VESPERS AS EVANGELIZATION AND CATECHESIS

The structure of Vespers lends itself to evangelization and catechesis of people encountering God for the first time and advanced in their walk with Christ.

We pray Psalms, grounding us in the universe God created for us. These Psalms give us a past, present and future with Christ, connecting with the Israelites of the past, praying for mercy on us presently and echoing our ache and hope for a better future on earth and new life in Christ, a longing common between new and old seekers of Christ

We offer up prayer intentions through litanies and repeated responses, entering a meditative or contemplative state towards God. Non-Christians may be familiar with meditation; Through the liturgical service repetition, our thoughts focus on God as we ponder His Mystery.

We incorporate poetry and song from the Christian age, incorporated by the Church into the services as she has seen fit. These poems and songs remind us of Christ's love, grace and saving works for, as well as saints, apostles, prophets, and martyrs who have come before us and set an example for us, strengthening all those on the journey toward union with God.

As we seek to deepen our liturgical life in Christ and begin praying Vespers, ask to borrow a Great Vespers book or look in the Church library for a Horologion book and put study the prayers in preparation. Alternatively, download the ECPubs app and pray Vespers using the prayers provided. Let us seek to glorify God both personally and communally!
