Food for Thought from the editor:

What is the CERT?

The Community Emergency Response
Team (CERT) Program educates people about
disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster
response skills, such as fire safety, light search
and rescue, team organization, and disaster
medical operations. There is also a TEEN CERT
program. You can find out more at:

https://www.fema.gov/community-emergency-response-teams or talk to DJ, KJ6DJ

The CERT introduction from the FEMA web site: "If we can predict that emergency services will not meet immediate needs following a major disaster, especially if there is no warning as in an earthquake and people will spontaneously volunteer, what can government do to prepare citizens for this eventuality?

First, present citizens the facts about what to expect following a major disaster in terms of immediate services. Second, give the message about their responsibility for mitigation and preparedness. Third, train them in needed life saving skills with emphasis on decision making skills, rescuer safety and doing the greatest good for the greatest number. Fourth, organize teams so that they are an extension of first responder services offering immediate help to victims until professional services arrive."

Why be involved in CERT?

After every disaster there is a 'what could we do better' evaluation. All levels of emergency services providers try to find a better way to prepare for and increase the survival rate of both the rescuers and victims of fire, flood, tornado, tsunami, hurricane, earthquake, and any other disaster. The CERT program is the recent outcome of lessons learned. Your involvement in CERT may mean attending training that tells you what to expect and how to prepare for an emergency. It may mean you want to learn life saving skills and know what decisions are the right ones for yourself, your family and your neighbors. It may mean your Ham Radio use and skills as part of a team. Disaster can impact 1 or many. I have been lax about even carrying my personal medical equipment with me. Recent up dates to emergency preparedness at work reminded me—no I am not ready. I have since fixed this.

If you are the one are you ready?

I want you to make it through anything that comes our way in these uncertain days. After all we live in the earthquake state.
