When we say, "No", to handing out free diapers for the third time to a young mom who desperately needs a chance to behold the manner of love the Father has given unto her, we are saying "Yes" to a chance for her to be immersed in truth and fellowship as she attends a class and earns the diapers that she needs. When we say "No", to the idea that a young mom shares asking whether or not she should move her married boyfriend into her house with her children, "just until he can get on his feet financially", (continued *)

Take a closer look and you'll see our amazing volunteers are instructing one of many classes that they have faithfully given time and energy to in order to minister to some precious ladies who have overcome insurmountable obstacles and heartache. There sits a woman who has found strength to overcome a long term abusive relationship that left her permanently injured. In the months since attending Soulutions, she has established herself in her own apartment, gotten involved in a local church where she attends regularly, attends Soulutions Center as one of our most faithful participants, and is taking steps toward adult literacy as her goal is to learn to read- Praise God. Look a bit closer and you'll see a woman who has gone through the agony of losing her spouse to a sudden illness and while he awaits her in glory, the pain of the separation and the reality of becoming a single parent literally overnight has been excruciating and exhausting. She has taken hours to piece together memory quilts with her husband's shirts along with a quilt for her daughter that uses sentimental clothing items. Yet another young mother finds comfort in this small group setting as she has been crippled by anxiety and depression for years. Soulutions is a place where she feels welcome and receives the loving nudge she needs to continue on in good choices. There is real healing going on in these classes as women come together and support eachother with fellowship and friendshipThe second picture shows some precious children getting actively involved in sharing the gospel with every tribe and tongue through Operation Christmas Child of Samaritan's Purse. Two of these children were living with a family friend for several months as their home situation (all the way across the country!) was one that they needed to be removed from. During their time here, they attended Christian summer camp at Sacandaga Bible Conference and there were most definitely

"You can't make this stuff up," those are words I have spoken more times than I can count in response to conversations with one of our precious volunteers. This story—true by all accounts—is especially timely as it all culminates at Christmas and is one of many bizarre, almost unbelievable situations that have strengthened rather than weakened this growing believer's faith. It all started back in the Spring when the unthinkable happened; a rented storage unit holding nearly all of her earthly possessions was, essentially, robbed. Through a series of crazy events, the rental company released the key to the unit to someone claiming to be our volunteer—a case of identity fraud that caused EVERYTHING in that storage unit to be gone in a matter of less than an hour. Beyond the value of the household items was the anguish of having the most sentimental items taken items that would mean nothing to anyone but her—items like family pictures and handmade Christmas ornaments from when her now grown children were small. My heart broke for her. I'm ashamed to admit that I viewed the chances as slim to none that her precious items would be returned. We prayed over it and I watched an unshakeable peace exemplified in her attitude toward the situation. Fast forward to late fall and a call from the police prompted a ride to an abandoned building where a number of boxes, bins, and random items were found. No sign of the ornaments anywhere. A few household items were in fact hers but her heart's treasures were long gone...or so we thought. A few weeks later a knock on her door brought a police officer and another bin of items that had turned up elsewhere. As she began to unpack the box, a familiar ornament, then another, then another. By now I'm in tears as she tells me yet another testament to God's amazing grace—a way that He knew her heart, knew her need and brought her those tiny little items of immeasurable value to a mother's heart. Her Christmas wish was granted and the love of a Heavenly Father made evident....yet again.
