

27th Sunday in Ordinary Time (year C) Sunday 2 October 2022 **Still only Servants**

In today's Gospel, Jesus talks about a servant who has been ploughing or minding the sheep all day. Yet when he comes home in the evening, far from getting a pat on the back from his master, or being allowed to put his feet up, is expected to get his master's supper ready. Only then is he free to get his own supper. And in behaving like this, he mustn't think that he has done anything exceptional. All he has done is fulfil his duty as a servant. The treatment of the servant implied here would seem to be cruel. We have to understand what Jesus was saying in this little parable. He was telling his disciples about the kind of spirit they were to bring to their service of God. Consider the following example.

It was late afternoon on a raw winter's day in Dublin. Everybody was in a hurry to get home. Suddenly a cry arose: 'There's a man in the river!" People rushed to the wall and looked down into the muddy, uninviting water. Sure enough, there was a man down there trashing about in the dark water. His desperate cries for help reached the onlookers above the din of the traffic. Then, with a screech of brakes, a car swung out of the line of traffic, and came to a halt close to the kerb. A young man jumped out, throwing off his coat and shoes as he did so. He got up on the wall, took a quick look down, and then dived into the murky waters. He quickly grabbed the drowning man and hauled him to safety. Out on the roadside a crowd gathered around the rescued man as they waited for an ambulance to come. Presently it arrived and took the man to hospital from where he was released, none the worse of his ordeal. A reporter came by, and seeing the possibility of a story, began to fish for information. But, far from seeking the limelight or the plaudits of the people, the rescuer had vanished. That's the kind of spirit we are to bring to our service of God. There is a tendency among religious people to think that they can put God in their debt. They imagine God as being like the typical employer. If we do the work, then in justice our employer owes us our wages. This gives rise to a sense of entitlement. God owes us a reward in heaven providing we serve him faithfully on earth. Apart from being misguided, this introduces a mercenary attitude into what is essentially supposed to be a love affair between God and us.

At the time of Jesus, Judaism was dominated by the notion of merit – God 'owed' salvation to humans in return for keeping the Law. Jesus rejected this, and emphasised God's sheer goodness. We can never put God in the position where He is in debt to us. Even when we have done all we are expected to do (and which of us would be so bold as to make that claim), we still cannot make any demands on God. Christianity is a religion of grace, not of merit. We should behave ourselves

honourably, not out of hope of a reward, but out of love for God zeal for his service. The most generous and heroic deeds in life are those that are performed, not in the line of duty in the hope of monetary or other rewards, but out of pure love.
